Our plan is to introduce them at the end of the Annual Meeting and open the voting at that time. Since this is a by-lot vote, each packet will be tailored to each member’s situation. The manner of voting is different than the annual meeting process. The Board voted to allow members to vote by mail, by proxy, or in person. The voting packet will be mailed out after the annual meeting. The staff has done a tremendous amount of work on gathering all the lot and parcel information. We are using parcel ID’s on record with Madison County. Once you receive the packet, if you feel there is an error with the number of parcels listed, please contact the office directly.

He gave so much of his time and effort to our community and will be sorely missed by all that knew him.
