DECALS & ASSOCIATE MEMBER CARDS

2026 decals are yellow . Bring in a copy of your registration and proof of \$300,000 watercraft liability insurance (for motorized boats) as soon as your 2026 Dues & Assessments are paid in full. There are four types of decals: motorized, non-motorized (kayaks, paddle-boards, canoes etc), PWC’s and non-highway vehicles (golf carts, side-by-sides etc.) Non-highway vehicles decals are \$15.00. 2025 decals expired on April 30, 2026. Watercraft in the water or on lifts are required to have 2026 decals by May 1.

Associate member cards expired December 31, 2025.

Please request in the office when your 2026 dues & assessments are paid in full.

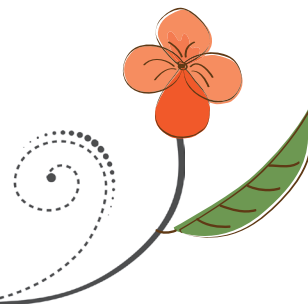

At press time our lake was wake with several inches to go before we reach full pool. Boating season is right around the corner. Please keep in mind that 2026 boat decals need to be on your boat by May 1st. This includes boats on lifts. You will need your dues and assessments paid, current registration and proof of \$300K watercraft liability insurance to get your new stickers. I would like to remind all those utilizing the boat ramp at the Marina to please lock it after putting your watercraft in or taking it out of the lake. Keys are available in the office for \$3.00

Spring is here and many are hoping to plan summer vacations. Madison County Sheriffs will come check your house while you are away once per shift and all you do, is call them. This is a free service provided by the county and is a great way to ensure our neighborhood is protected. Just the presence of the Sheriff in our community could be a great deterrent from unwanted activity. To request a check on your home contact the Sheriff's Office at (618) 692-4433

Maintenance will be working our roadways to fix the potholes winter has left behind and to get our roads designated for resurfacing prepared. Please exercise caution when you see our crew working and be patient if delayed. In April, we went over Building Construction and Fire Flows, and had an ARCH helicopter come by to review pediatric patient care and prepare proper landing zones. In June, we will have Fire Extinguisher and Confined Space Awareness classes, along with practicing our Water Rescue techniques with some of our neighboring fire departments. On July 4th we will be present at the Ski Show and will be stationed on either side of the dam for the evening fireworks. We answered 28 calls the past month (we can no longer break down the type of calls) and gave mutual aid 4 times

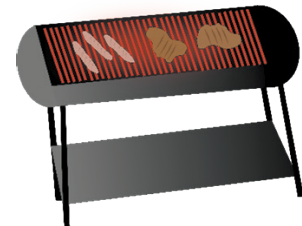
(to Bethalto, Edwardsville, Meadowbrook, and Prairietown) and received mutual aid 7 times (Edwardsville, Hamel, Meadowbrook x2, Prairietown x2, and Worden). HSVFD is very fortunate to have top-of-the-line trucks and equipment to respond to any and all types of situations. We have access to classes and training, and we review and practice our skills so that we are always prepared. Our department is staffed by volunteers, so if you would like to become part of our family and help someone out when they need it the most, stop by any Monday evening between 7-9pm to talk with us. We have something available for anyone wishing to join: from helping around the station, to operating the radio, becoming a first responder or an EMT and going on medical calls, responding to car accidents, or becoming a firefighter. 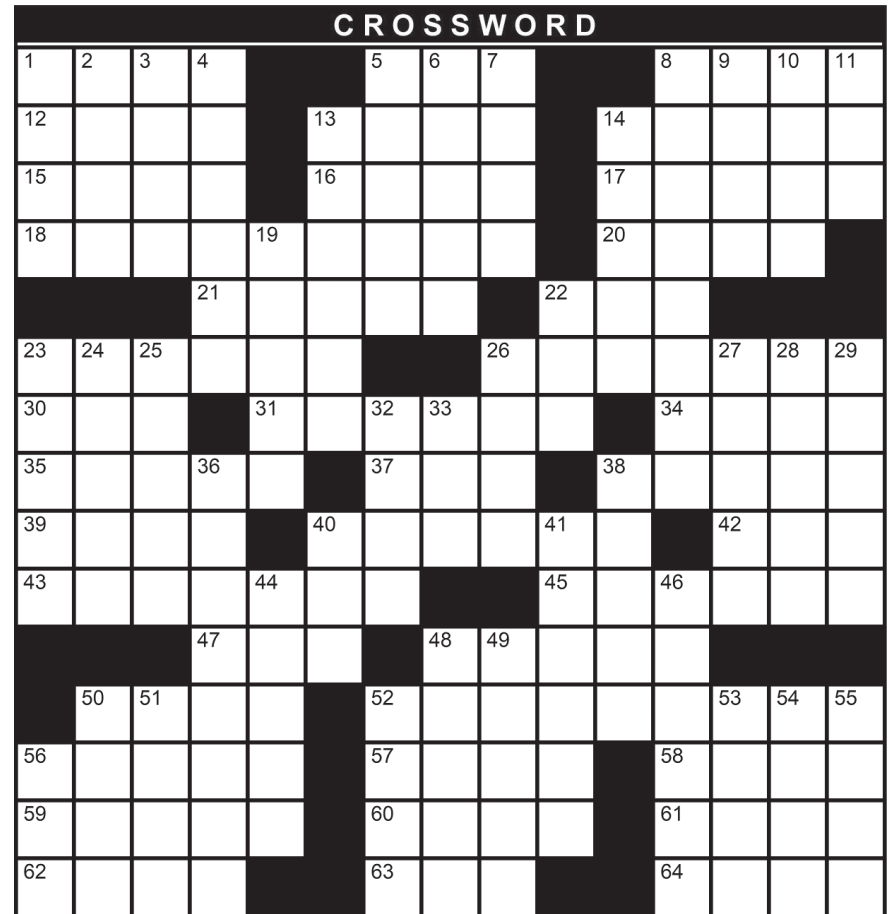

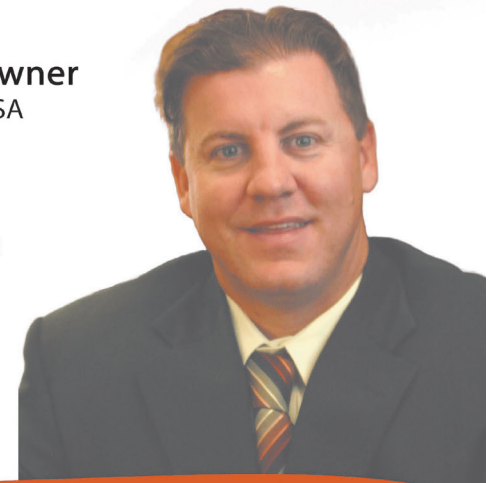

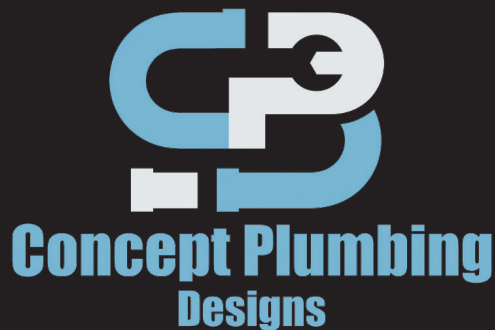

MAY GARDENING TIPS:

- Great time to repot overgrown house plants. Use a pot no more than one to two inches larger than current pot.
- Gradually acclimate house plants you want to move outside when night temperatures will remain above 50 degrees. Slowly expose them to bright sunlight to prevent sunburn damage.
- Pests become a problem – watch for tent worms and prune off branch, destroy cocoons and tents. Slugs hide during the day, if plants are being eaten, place a board nearby, slugs will likely gather during the day – remove and dispose. Bagworms begin to emerge from mother’s bag and start to form their own. Collect and dispose of the bags.

Keeping Us Out of the Fire

Is the God of the Bible just an impulsive, capricious fool who is really at fault for human sin and wrong? That view looks like this. God makes up a bunch of senseless rules like 'I don't like red shoes' and 'nobody shall wear them' and 'disobedient people who do will go to hell.' But then God loves the sinner so much that he kills his Son, Jesus, in his place taking his penalty so that the sinner doesn't have to die. What a stupid God, they say. If only He hadn't made that senseless rule in the first place....

But that doesn't at all picture what God has done. Rather, it's like this. You are out camping alone in a forested area. You build a fire one morning to enjoy bacon and eggs. You leave the campsite for a hike but fail to extinguish your campfire. A couple of hours later you look back toward your campsite and see fire along the tree tops and smoke pouring into the sky. You realize it is your fire, out of control. To your horror, you see that the wind is blowing the flames in your direction and it's coming fast! You can't outrun it. If things continue as they are, death is certain. And it will be horrible death. And it's all your fault.

You start to feel the heat from the flames. There is no way out. The fire you set is going to come back and kill you. Then someone appears, racing toward you. He is strong and young. He grabs you, wraps you in his own personal fireproof blanket and pushes you onto the ground. Finally the fire passes. The heat diminishes. It's over. You peek out of the blanket and see a body on the ground. Then it hits you, your rescuer gave his shield and his life so that you could be saved.

That's really the way it is. The sinful things we do in life, light a fire that eventually comes to destroy us. Jesus is the only One who can save us from the inferno of our sin. This he does at the cost of his own life. There is nothing stupid about this, just a demonstration of love and compassion.

BOATING SAFETY

Legal Compliance – “All watercraft operated on Holishor Association Lakes must adhere to and comply with state and federal laws as stated in the Illinois Registration and Safety Act.”

Speed Limit – “The maximum speed of any watercraft operated on Holiday Lake shall be 55mph or as defined in the Reckless Operation section of the Holiday Shores Boating Rules. Operation of said watercraft shall be in a manner that does not create an exaggerated wake. Intentionally ‘plowing’ or ‘pushing water’ at speeds greater than no-wake, but less than those typically maintained while ‘on plane’ is not permitted.”

Watercraft/Registration – “All watercraft being operated on Holiday and Su Twan Lakes must have a current state registration decal and numbers, **only current Holiday Shores decal**, and lot numbers affixed.”

Operating Age – *The age of operator, Boating Safety Class requirements, carrying capacities and horsepower shall be as prescribed by state and federal laws governing boating. (See the current Illinois Boat Registration and Safety Act) (625 ILCS 45). Operators of any watercraft must follow the age requirements as noted in the Illinois Boating Requirement and Safety Act.* Persons born on or after January 1, 1998 may operate a vessel powered by a motor greater than 10 horsepower (hp) only if they have a valid Boating Safety Certificate accepted by IDNR. Persons at least 10 years of age and less than 12 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horse power only if the person is under the direct on-board supervision of a parent or guardian who meets the requirements of subsection (a) or a person at least 18 years of age who meets the requirements of subsection (a) and is designated by a parent or guardian. Persons at least 12 years and less than 18 years of age may operate a motorboat with over 10 horse power only if the person meets the requirements of subsection (a) or is under the direct on-board supervision of a parent or guardian who meets the requirements of subsection (a) or a person at least 18 years of age who meets the requirements of subsection (a) and is designated by a parent or guardian. The owner of a motorboat or a person given supervisory authority over a motorboat shall not permit a motorboat with over 10 horse power to be operated by a person who does not meet the Boating Safety Certificate requirements of this Section.

No one may operate a watercraft except a member, associate member or guest accompanied by a member.

Watercraft Limit – No member shall have more than three motorized watercraft registered to the same membership in operation at one time.

Size Limit – All watercraft being operated on Holiday Lake except pontoon boats with tubular bottoms, are limited to 22 feet in length. Pontoons are restricted to 28 feet.

Traffic Pattern – All watercraft being operated on Holiday Lake must follow a counterclockwise direction of travel, similar to that of operating a motor vehicle on the road-way.

Boating Hours – Boating on Holiday and Su Twan Lakes is permitted 24 hours a day, but watercraft are restricted to No-Wake speeds from sunset to sunrise. Su Twan only electric or muscular powered watercraft...NO ENGINES

Noise Level Limit – No watercraft may be operated on Holiday or Su Twan Lakes in a manner that exceeds a noise level of 75 decibels. This restriction includes inboard/outboard motors, stereos, etc.

Restricted Areas – No person shall operate any watercraft in a restricted area which has been designated a “No Wake” area, swimming area, or an otherwise restricted area except in the prescribed manner. Holiday Lake is considered No-Wake when the lake reaches 9” above full pool and 16” below full pool.

Reckless or Careless Operation – **Careless:** No person shall operate any watercraft in a careless or heedless manner so as to endanger any person or property or at a rate of speed greater than will permit him in the exercise of reasonable care to bring the watercraft to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead. **Reckless:** No person shall operate any watercraft, specialty prop-craft, personal watercraft or manipulate any water skis, aquaplane, or similar device in such a manner as to willfully or wantonly endanger the life, limb, or property of any person, to weave through congested traffic, to jump the wake of another vessel or when visibility around the other vessel is obstructed, to wait until the last possible moment to swerve to avoid collision, or operate any watercraft so as to approach or pass another watercraft in such a manner or at such a rate of speed as to create a hazardous wake or wash. This restriction also applies to the misuse of water skis, wake boards, or other devices.

Towing of Persons – No person may operate a watercraft which has in tow or is otherwise assisting a person on water skis, aquaplane or other similar contrivance, in or upon any waterway, unless such watercraft is occupied by at least two (2) competent persons capable of assisting a skier in case of injury or accident.

Distance – Operators must keep a safe and reasonable distance between their craft and other lake users, such as swimmers, downed skiers, fishermen, etc. They must also maintain a distance of 75ft from shore when making a wake. Seventy-five-foot markers have been replaced with new, larger white/blue buoys.

Orange Flag – Operators are required to display a bright orange flag on their vessel **any time they have a skier, tuber, wake boarder, etc. in the water.** The flag must be a 12 inch by 12 inch square and affixed to the highest point of the craft, such as a ski tower or pontoon top.

Racing – Racing of any watercraft on Holiday or Su Twan Lakes is prohibited.

Power Turns – Power turns (180o or 360o short radius turns under power) are allowed, unless the following occur (3/26/97) • So as to be unreasonably close to another vessel to cause it to stop, swerve unnecessarily or take evasive action. • So as to cause the occupants/riders to be thrown from the watercraft

No power turns will be allowed in any cove or be done in such a manner as to be a nuisance.

Engine Cut-Off – All watercraft (prop-driven and PWC’s) equipped with an engine cut-off device may not be operated unless the device is properly functioning and it’s lanyard is securely attached to the driver.
