

HOLIDAY SHORES FIRE DEPARTMENT

Firefighter's Footnote - Fall is officially here and it's that time of year to burn

leaves. Burn in designated areas away from structures or overhanging limbs; keep a water hose ready; don't leave any fires unattended; and don't burn on windy days. Watch out for kids to and from the bus stops now that the daylight hours are shortening. Halloween is coming up so remember to layer clothes and costumes if the weather is chilly, make sure your child can see out from any masks they might wear, carry flashlights or glow sticks along with reflective clothing so they are easily visible, and have a great and ghoulish Halloween this year! Thank you to everyone that came to our sunrise or sunset ceremony this year on 9/11. We continue to honor the 343 firefighters who gave their lives while helping others, and the commitment we made to never forget them when we received a piece of steel beam from one of the World Trade Towers.

In September, we had our Mass Casualty training event (something we hope to never put to use in real life), and welcomed several neighboring fire departments to practice along with us. Being a volunteer department means you may have to rely on your neighbors for help, and we are very fortunate to have many surrounding districts available to help when needed, or for us to provide mutual aid in return. Next month we will review Fireground Management/Reading Smoke and have a hands-on training with a Live Burn – with our fellow nearby fire departments again.

Last month we responded to 17 incidents: 9 EMS calls; 2 MVAs; 2 Assist invalid; 2 Move-up/Standby for another department; and 1 each for Shorted electrical equipment and CO detector activation. We received Mutual Aid once each from Prairietown, Meadowbrook, and Edwardsville; and gave Mutual Aid once each to Prairietown and Meadowbrook.

October 5-11 is Fire Prevention week, and HSVFD is having an Open House on Saturday, October 25 from 1-4pm. Learn about fire safety and also have fun! There will be food, games, and raffles. Take a tour of the fire department and sit in a fire truck! Find out if becoming a member of the Holiday Shores Volunteer Fire De-



partment is for you. Stop by on Monday evenings from 7-9pm to talk to us, follow us on Facebook, or check out our website at www.hsfd.org. Hope to see you at our Open House!

Fire Prevention Safety Tips. Fire Prevention Week October 5-11

- Never play with fire, matches, candles or stoves.
- Keep an ABC fire extinguisher nearby and know how to use it.
- Know your safety plan in case of a fire and have practice fire drills.
- Have two exits to get out of the building in case of a fire.
- If there is a fire in your house, get low to the ground and get outside quickly.
- Know your safe place away from your house where you should meet.
- Call 911 after you are at your safe place and know your address.
- Close doors as you leave if you can do so safely.
- •Never go back into a burning house for anything not even for toys or pets.
- If something you are wearing catches fire, remember to stop, drop and roll.
- Make sure you have working smoke alarms and CO (carbon monoxide) detectors in your house, and change the batteries regularly.
- If you see firefighters wearing bulky clothes, a large mask, carrying big tools, wearing flashlights and making loud noises, it may be scary but they are there to help you. Don't hide from them.



Manager's Report by Angie Webster



The lake draw down began September 20th lowering our lake between 4'3" and 4'6". This level will be held until December 10th, so the lake can then refill. The lake refills with rain, snow, or basically water runoff. Make sure to remove your boats early so you don't get your boat grounded.

Lakes and Dam committee has been out to assessed seawall. You should have received a letter by now. I encourage all lake front members to do their own inspection once the water goes down. The assessment was done by boat with lake at full pool, and there may be damage that was not seen at the time of the assessment. I wish to thank the committee for their hard work and time that it took to complete. Rip rap and soil cloth can be purchased through the Holishor Office. Rip Rap is \$40 a ton. Soil cloth \$4 per foot. Soil cloth is 15ft wide. Please call the office to set up amount, payment and delivery schedule.

Building committee meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each Month. Permits for those meetings should be turned into the Holishor office no later than noon on the Friday before meeting. Last meeting we had 22 permits and we anticipate we will have a lot of them to get through over the next several weeks.

With the fall season comes falling leaves. While burning of yard waste is permitted from sunrise to sunset, please use caution burning and refrain from burning on windy days. Never leave a fire burning unattended. Yard waste pick up is weekly & included in your trash bill, up to 8 bags per week. Please refrain from blowing leaves or yard waste into our lake, it is not good for our eco system. Please be mindful of your neighbors. Please keep ditches and culverts free and clear of yard waste and debris. This ensures that water flows correctly. The maintenance crew has been out sweeping excess rock from our recent road oil and chip. We will be out over the next several weeks to ensure we get the loose gravel up. We don't want to plow it into people's yards come wintertime.

The Holishor Association Board of Director's meetings are held the 2nd & 4th Wednesdays January-October & the 2nd Wednesday only in November & December at 7:30 pm in clubhouse ballroom.

All Holishor members are welcome to attend.
If you cannot attend you may submit a written
correspondence to go to the Board. It must be received in
the Holishor office by noon Friday prior to the Board
meeting. This allows the Board time to research the issue
before the meeting.

The Holishor Building Committee meets the 1st Tuesday of December-March & the 1st & 3rd Tuesdays April-November at 6:30pm in the Library in the lower level of the clubhouse.



Holishor Association Fishing Committee

Holiday Shores Members,

It's time for our drawdown of the lake which occurs every five years. This will begin on September 20th and refilling will proceed no later than December 10th. Due to the very large runoff area that feeds the lake, full pool should be achieved by next spring when everyone wants to again start enjoying all the lake has to offer.

There are many impacts to our lake community during this drawdown. It affords lake lot owners an opportunity to make necessary repairs or additions to seawalls, docks, and fish habitat (don't forget your permits for repairs and/or construction). The exposed, muddy shorelines can often look unattractive during this time, but we can use this period to improve our properties and the lake as a fishery.

Fishery improvements include adding Board approved artificial fish habitats under docks to aid in spawning efforts and survival rate of juvenile fish. The fishing committee has a limited number of artificial structures that will be available free of charge to place under docks. Please let the Holiday Shores Office know if you would like to be considered for a structure under your dock.

Another key advantage of the lake lowering is population control of species of fish that are overpopulated in the lake. This includes shad and crappie, both of which are grossly overpopulated. A well-managed / gradual drawdown such as the one on Holiday Lake can act as a population reset tool for lakes with too many shad and crappie, especially when paired with predator fish stocking such as bass and hybrid stripers. This year the fishing committee while working with the Holiday Shores Board of Directors stocked these two species and are planning a stocking in the Spring of 2026 as well. With these efforts we hope to bring the fishery into more of a balance for all to enjoy.

One other consideration during this fall transition is that we ask that you please do not blow or rake leaves into the lake. As leaves decay in the lake, bacteria use oxygen to break them down which leads to oxygen depletion and can ultimately harm the fish population, especially if we encounter a long freeze. Further negative impacts of leaves in the water include adding phosphorus and nitrogen in the lake which can trigger dreaded algal blooms in the Spring and Summer. Please consider disposing of leaves in a different manner and keep our lake healthy. Thank you, Holiday Shores Fishing Committee

Holishor Association Board of Director's Minutes

August 13, 2025

Call to Order

Ty Van Ryswyk called the meeting to order at 7:36 p.m.

Board Members in Attendance: Jennifer Halverson, Ty Van Ryswyk, Trish Yates, Ben Kelley, Tony Harris, Jim McCann

Association Office Present: Angie Webster, Karla Suttles

Members Present: 7

Board Members Excused: John Crotty

Pledge of Allegiance recited.

Approval of Minutes

Tony Harris motioned to approve noted changes for the July 23, 2025, meeting minutes. Trish Yates seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

Transfers of Property

There were 4 transfers of property, all of which had initiation fees. Membership is 1273. Association lot 1921 was sold on June 27, 2025.

Bills & Salaries

Tony Harris motioned to approve the bills & salaries, Trish Yates seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Profit & Loss Summary: Jennifer Halverson: I noticed some of the income line items were significantly above projections, such as forfeited deposits and late fees. Angie Webster: Confirmed that we are collecting more late fees.

Treasurer's report: No questions presented.

Manager's Report & Code Enforcement Report

Angie Webster read the manager's report (which can be found published in full in the Holiday Times).

Jim McCann: Noted that Republic must be used for any dumpster rentals. Members have called about the yard waste bins and were quoted a price. Per the revised contract, the first one should be free. Working with Rhonda to correct the contract in the system. They currently do not have yard waste bins, however, if you call they will add your name to a list and deliver once available.

Ty Van Ryswyk summarized the code enforcement report and noted 35 incidents reported last month, resulting in 29 citations written. Noted issues on the lake pertained to decals and no lights after sunset. Property related incidents included signs, maintenance of properties, and building permit violations. Ty Van Ryswyk commended Lake Patrol and Code Enforcement for doing a great job enforcing our rules and members are asked to give them respect.

Old Business

Restaurant Committee Update — Ceiling tiles have been ordered. Identified that the mini-split in the kitchen is a high-end system and should be cleaned and retained. Angie is working on bids to clean and an ongoing maintenance agreement. The kitchen floor requires cleaning, sanding, and epoxy due to grease buildup and lack of maintenance. Estimated cost is \$2,300 plus equal cost for labor. Once completed, this should not be needed again. Working to address the emergency shut-off valve. Working to obtain the password for the security cameras. Two additional prospects were discussed at the last meeting. We are waiting on the financial details. Confirmed that no one has been selected at this time.

CB&R Feedback — At the last meeting, the committee shared the prioritized list of potential bylaw and rule changes for the board to review and provide feedback if priority should change on any of the items. The committee will focus on the high priority changes and will start adding those to the agenda. **Jennifer Halverson:** We are projecting at least another 2 months to complete proposed revisions for the Building Rules to clarify the language and make proposed changes. High priority bylaw and rules changes will start being submitted for the board to review.

New Business

Fishing Study Review – The report was shared with the Board and included suggestions. It will be forwarded to the Fishing Committee for review and feedback before being posted for the community to review.

HSBAR Variance (1358) – The Murphy's are requesting that the Board acknowledge they are not in violation of Article III, Sec 2, I. Maintenance of Prop-

erty, 3. General Aesthetics, which prohibits "overgrown or neglected landscaping and gardens." They indicated that their current landscaping is intentional, actively maintained, and part of a long-term renovation plan, asking the Board to prevent any penalties while they complete their design. Angie has received 5 complaints about the property. Amanda Murphy (1358): Acknowledged receiving a letter that they were in violation and would like to summarize the dissertation and attest to how they are not in violation. **Jim McCann:** The bylaws have outlined the process for violations of rules and recommends that process be followed. Cautioned the board against proceeding with the summary in advance of the hearing. **Tony Harris:** Asked that they proceed with a summary as it will likely be the same now vs later. Acknowledged that anyone can approach the board. Ty Van **Ryswyk:** Stated that we can hear the summary but we will not make a ruling tonight. Angie Webster: Action on fines was delayed at the Murphy's request to discuss their position with the Board. Following tonight's meeting, fines will begin tomorrow. Recipients may appeal through the Hearing Committee as outlined in the fine letter. Amanda Murphy (1358): Quoted the bylaw: "General Aesthetics: Members shall ensure their property is neat and orderly. The keeping of an unkept or unsightly property or neglecting to maintain one's property may result in corrective guidance and/or punitive measures by Holishor Association. Unkept or unsightly properties shall be those lots whereby goods or materials of any kind are stored or are allowed to collect in view of other members and the general public in such a manner as to appear uncared-for, cluttered or messy." No members have raised concerns. She acknowledged the trailer, children's play area, and surrounding plants, noting their role in erosion control. The plan is to identify which plants thrive, then replant or seed them during the two annual planting seasons. Invasive plants will be replaced. A fallen tree is being used as a balance beam to create a natural play area. Indicated that nothing was uncared for, cluttered, or messy. **Tony Harris:** The current approach is not consistent with neighborhood standards. Suggested defining flower beds and regular mowing, as the entire yard cannot serve as a flower bed. Based on photos, the yard appears unkept compared to neighbors. Recommended working with the Garden Club for guidance. Amanda Murphy (1358): She confirmed the yard is hand-trimmed and mowed. The bylaws do not specify where flower beds must be located or where flowers must be planted. She allows flowers to grow naturally, noting that other members also have flowers outside of defined beds. She reiterated that her plants are not overgrown but at their intended size. **Trish Yates:** Asked for a timeline to move the flowers. **Amanda Murphy (1358):** Plants can be moved and clustered in September, with planting required by October 31 (first frost). Some will die back but reemerge in spring. Ty Van Ryswyk: The yard's appearance would likely be perceived as unkept by most observers. The Children's Museum style natural play area was recognized as part of a long-term plan that is still developing. However, it does not appear that this plan can reasonably be completed by October. Amanda Murphy (1358): Acknowledged that it will take time as there is 8 inches of rock followed by tarp to dig through to plant. **Angie Webster:** Noted receiving many complaints about properties, has issued over 500 warning letters for maintenance. and has referred similar yards to Madison County. Tony Harris: Asked to compare yard to those around them. Also noted the remaining part of the bylaw that was not read - "Landscaping, gardens, and any other ornamental devices shall be in good taste so as not to be offensive to the community in general." **Jennifer Halverson:** Noted that it will be challenging for the board to determine which plants are flowers vs unkept plants. Asked for a plan for revisions and a timeline to be presented to the Hearing Committee. Ty Van Ryswyk: Reiterated to come forward with a well-defined landscape design along with a timeline. Amanda Murphy (1358): Continued to reiterate that the bylaw does not tell her where she can or cannot plant. Asked for a timeline to complete her plan. Trish Yates: Noted that the timeline depends on how long she would like to get fined if an agreement is not reached in the Hearing Committee.

Correspondence1851, 1855, 1977, 1850, 1872 - The members using Captain's Cove for boating are requesting that the Board provide \$4,000-\$5,000 to fund excavation of the cove to remove leaf and silt buildup. The proposed work would restore navigability by using a long-boom excavator to dredge the cove and deposit the spoil into low areas of Captain's Park. **Ty Van Ryswyk:** Reported that



with sediment removal and culvert replacements, there is no budget left this year. Roger Rawson (1851): Stated they requested this at the last drawdown and were denied. Concerned members are maintaining what the Association should maintain. Noted that he dug out the cove in 2010. Ty Van Ryswyk: Explained the sediment plan is to address additional coves with each drawdown. **Tony Harris:** Noted they are starting with the main source and problem area. Future actions and reserve needs will depend on this project's outcome. Angie Webster: Questioned why the 2010 cove excavation filled back in and asked what is causing it. Roger Rawson (1851): Said 95% comes from tree leaves. Angie Webster: Estimated \$250K is needed every five years for sediment removal, requiring \$50K in reserves annually. Roger Rawson (1851): Shared that when he dug out, he went 10 feet down but not all the way across, so sludge filled back in. Thanked the Board for their services and Angie for progress seen over the last couple of years. Jerry Theodore (1346): Noted he dug out his cove twice (1995, 2020). Emphasized shared ownership of the lake and suggested a special assessment. **Action Summary: Prior Actions:**

Microphones have been ordered and will be installed in June. **Update: Microphones installed but there is a receiver issue.**

Engage drone company for silt removal. Update: Second bid was declined as vendor does not work with HOAs. Ty is pursuing another estimate. One bid came in at \$35K per flyover (3 needed). Alternative pricing by truckload discussed. Ty to follow up with vendor. Path forward expected by end of August; agenda item for next meeting.

Obtain cameras for the North property and post about the fence and prior damages. Office to audit and update the committee members by Sept 1. **Update: Confirmations obtained from everyone except for the Finance committee.**Tony will provide the office with a list of members. Street sign replacement at Fountainblue & Sextant. Lights at Marina for the boat ramp. **Update:**Angie plans to talk to Al in the fall.

Approval of Minutes

Tony Harris *motioned* to approve the August 13, 2025, meeting minutes. **Ben Kelley** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

Transfers of Property

There was 1 transfer of property, which had an initiation fee. Membership is 1273.

Article V Directors, Section 13 Financial Management Bylaw Change

Review and approve final bylaw changes allowing the Association to invest through a brokerage firm, with clarification that funds awaiting investment remain insured under FDIC or SIPC coverage. **Jim McCann** motioned to approve the bylaw as presented, **Tony Harris** seconded, all in favor. The bylaw will be included in the 2026 annual meeting packet for approval by the membership. **Restaurant Committee Update** – Revised lease has been provided to the board, with any further changes due to Jim before the September 10 meeting. The attorney will review once revisions are finalized. Ceiling tile has been removed.

The mini-split is operational and has been cleaned. The electrical drop in the kitchen has been fixed. The emergency gas shut off is scheduled to be fixed. Obtaining bids to sand and clean the floor in the kitchen. Estimate to clean the floors is \$2,500-\$5,000.

Silt Removal Measurement – Discussions with the contractor have led to additional options for camera options to help with truck load measurements. This may include overhead cameras to capture truck contents.

1790 Update – Permit expired; board to receive updates every 6 months. Nick Sievers: Exterior product decisions complete; stonework in progress. Interior design decisions pending, but crew is proceeding with available work. Jim McCann: Asked how many crew members are working on the house at a time. Nick Sievers: Estimated 14 crew members, depending on task. Ty Van Ryswyk: Asked if there was a plan in place to finalize the exterior before winter. Nick Sievers: Estimated 4 weeks of stonework remain, dependent on subcontractor availability. Jennifer Halverson: What is the goal to complete the entire project? Nick Sievers: Target completion by summer 2026, dependent on homeowner decisions. Additional lot being used for staging. Tony Harris: Asked for a list of decisions that are pending input from the homeowner. Nick Sievers: Will share list of pending homeowner decisions if approved. Landscaping, pool, and dock designs underway.

New Business

HVAC Repair approval - On August 17, 2025 per correspondence between the board and Angie Webster, a 2nd bid to repair the HVAC system in the maintenance shed was provided for \$6400. A prior bid from Turney was submitted for \$5223. No additional bids were obtained. Given the excessive heat, the board agreed to accept an emergency motion to repair the HVAC unit. Tony Harris motioned to approve the bid from Turney for \$5223, Jim McCann seconded, Trish Yates, Ben Kelley all approved.

Part 3, Rules, Membership / Associate Member Club Activities Rule Change – Revisions remove the age requirement for operating watercraft (deferring to Illinois law) and replace 'Holishor' with 'Associate' to clarify ID card requirements. Tony Harris: Suggested removing the word class since the rule already requires a certificate. Ben Kelley: Requested that we remove the bullet stating that an associate member cannot participate in the Ski Club or add the other clubs to the list as not to discriminate against the Ski Club. Jim McCann: Noted that this was put in at the Ski Club's request. Tony Harris: Noted that removing the restriction would allow associate members to participate in the Ski Club on a first-come, first-served basis, whereas the rule was changed previously to prioritize members. Tony Harris motioned to approve the proposed changes with the modification to remove the word class, Jim McCann seconded. The rule will be posted for 4 weeks before final vote.

HSBAR Modifications & Landscaping Addition – Require a permit and \$1,000 deposit for all contractor landscaping projects (\$500 refunded if no road damage). Contractors are responsible for repairs; if not, responsibility passes to the member. Contractor Infraction Level 3 clarified as a weekly fine. **Tony Harris:** Clarified that if a member is doing the landscaping work, a permit is not required. Suggested faster and higher fines to ensure timely removal of materials/ equipment. John Crotty: Fines should apply to the member as well. Ty Van Ryswyk: Recommended permits be in the member's name to coordinate material placement with neighbors/contractor. **Jim McCann**: Recommended contractors review and sign the rules. **Ben Kelley**: Concerned some members lack storage space and that the permit/refund may discourage repairs. Ray Garber (1822): Ouestioned what fine structure exists for contractors and how it is enforced. **Tony** Harris: Confirmed fine structure for contractors and non-compliant contractors can be banned. **Anthony Harrell (560)**: Asked about builders when no homeowner is present. Noted damage to Westview from the recent builds and asked that we ensure fines are high enough to cover road repairs. **Jim McCann:** Builders usually own the lot when no homeowner contracts the work. Tony Harris: Recommended lowering permit fee and increasing refund. Ty Van Ryswyk: Suggested that we require pictures of the road within a quarter mile to be submitted with the permit. **Angie Webster**: Confirmed riprap will be delivered directly onto member's property, not the road.

Fish Stocking Request Spring 2026 - Fishing Committee requested fish stocking for Spring 2026 (April—May) be added to the next board agenda. They anticipate \$24,200 in combined funding from the Association, Fishing Committee, Tiki Bar Bass Club, and Shores Big Bass Tuesday, with plans to stock largemouth and hybrid striped bass from Keo Fish Farms. Committee recommends larger fish to improve survival and strengthen baitfish impact. Tony Harris: Asked if funds were collected and when purchase would begin. Jason Lowry (1714): Confirmed funds are collected. Plan is to submit request this fall so Keo can secure supply and rates. Larger fish targeted for higher survival; mixed sizes will enable growth tracking. Committee is building 100 large and 100 small fish structures, dependent on volunteer time/materials. Jim McCann motioned to approve stocking levels as proposed by the fishing committee, Ben Kelley seconded, all in favor, motion passed.




