

The North End excavation project is underway. So far, as of today a total of 10,500 cubic yards have been removed from the lake. We know this project is causing some road damage, and property damage on the edges of resident properties. Please know that I am aware of and monitoring the situation. Repairs will be made to return residents' properties back to normal. We do appreciate the level of patience that members along this project path have shown. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to me at the office ext. 1

Winter is around the corner, and the Holiday Season is almost upon us. It is the time of year for family and friends, cleaning leaves from the yard, and decorating the house for the Holidays. 



Holiday Shores Snow & Ice Removal

Snow plowing and ice control begins when there is two inches of snow and more is expected or when ice begins to make the roads hazardous. Ice control material is applied to location an "as needed" basis. It takes 4-5 hours to plow the entire community with only two inches of snow.

Please drive with caution anytime winter precipitation are on the roads.

DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE TO SEE IF THE SNOW PLOWS ARE OUT OR TO REPORT SNOW - Heavy traffic hills and main roads are plowed first.

What caution should I be aware of?

Do not park on the road during the snow removal process. Do not push snow on to the roadway, this creates a very hazardous condition.

What about driveways?

Maintenance personnel are not authorized to plow driveways & plows will not be lifted at the entrance to each individual driveway.

Clearance of driveway entrances is the responsibility of the resident. Plows may make several passes in order to widen the roads.

What about mailboxes?

The truck will get as close to the mailboxes as possible.
It is the homeowner's responsibility to keep the area in front of the mailbox cleared. Keep mailboxes closed at all times.

What about trashcans on pick up days?

Trashcans & recycle containers must be 4' off the road.

The snowplow drivers will not get out to move your containers and will not be responsible for damage.

USE CAUTION!!

When maintenance is out on the roads, stay a safe distance behind the trucks. If you cannot see the mirrors on the trucks, they will not be able to see you.



Cream Sauce:

- Oil or butter, for sauteeing
- 1/4 cup onions, small diced
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 cup mushrooms (such as baby portobello, button or shiitake), minced
 - 1 tablespoon picked thyme
 - 2 cups heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- 4 tablespoons water
- 2 tablespoons truffle oil salt, to taste pepper, to taste

Pizza:

Prime Rib Pasta with Broccoli and Cheese

Recipe courtesy of Beef Loving Texans Cook time: 10 minutes Servings: 2

- 6 tablespoons butter, divided
- 1 pound cooked leftover prime rib, cut into 1/2-inch pieces
- tablespoon minced garlic
- pound penne pasta, cooked pound broccoli, blanched
- 1/2 cup julienned sun-dried tomatoes
- 1/2 cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1/2 cup beef broth
- teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 cup fresh lemon juice
- 1 tablespoon white truffle oil
- 1/2 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley

Preheat large skillet over medium heat until hot. Add 2 tablespoons butter. When melted, add leftover prime rib; cook 3-5 minutes, or until lightly browned.

Add garlic and cook 1-2 minutes, or until fragrant. Stir in cooked pasta, broccoli, tomatoes and remaining butter. Add broth, salt and pepper. Cook 2-3 minutes, or until warmed through. Drizzle with lemon juice and truffle oil; sprinkle with cheese and parsley before serving.

Cooking tip: Drizzle with extra truffle oil before serving to enhance aroma.



Smoked Prime Rib

Recipe courtesy of Beef Loving Texans Cook time: 4 hours Servings: 30

- 6-8 pounds prime rib 2 tablespoons
 - kosher salt
- 2 tablespoons coarse ground black pepper vegetable oil spray

Season prime rib generously with salt and pepper.

Lightly coat grill grates with vegetable oil spray. Close cooking chamber lid.

Place 3-5 pounds charcoal in center of firebox. Open firebox air vent approximately 1-2 inches and smokestack damper halfway. With firebox lid open, stand back, carefully light charcoal and burn until covered with light ash, approximately 20 minutes.

Once coals ash over, add wood chunks. Do not shut

firebox lid until smoke is clean, often called "blue smoke."

Close firebox lid. Adjust firebox air vent and smokestack damper to regulate cooking temperature until it reaches ideal smoking temperature between 325-350 f.

Place prime rib on cooking grate in cooking chamber. Maintain consistent cooking temperature by adding wood chunks as needed. Monitor internal temperature of prime rib throughout cooking process. Smoke 3-4 hours; rotate and flip every hour.

Remove roast when meat thermometer registers 135 F for medium-rare; 145 F for medium.

Transfer roast to carving board; tent loosely with aluminum foil. Let stand 15-20 minutes. Temperature will continue to rise 10-15 F to reach 145 F for mediumrare; 160 F for medium.




