Manager's Report by Angie Webster



Spring is on the horizon and there is a lot going on. You will see the maintenance guys out patching potholes, checking culverts, and generally cleaning up the roads in order to prepare for the 2024 road chip and seal. We understand that there are a lot of problem areas and will do our best to get to them all. I would ask that while the crews are out working you reduce speed and be patient.

The final payment of dues & assessments was due May 1st. 2023 boat stickers expired April 30th. You must be paid in full by May 10 to attend the annual meeting on May 18th. If you are experiencing financial difficulties, please reach out to the office. We can help you with payment plan options to ease the burden.

Something that has been brought to our attention several times over the last couple of weeks is members blowing leaves into the lake. While we don't have a rule on this subject, blowing leaves into the lake is not recommended. Leaves blown into the lake rarely settle at the shoreline of origin. With winds and currents most settle in coves, causing sediment build up. Decaying leaves release nutrients which are good for soil but in excess are pollutants to the lake, acting as a fertilizer for hydrilla and algae blooms. Please consider collecting and mulching leaves spreading them on yards to return nutrients to your soil.

Over the next several weeks the clubhouse will be getting a mini facelift. As one of the focal points of our community I feel this is necessary and has been neglected too long. This includes removal of overgrowth and bushes. New plants and rock will be added. The garden club has offered their assistance and knowledge on this project which I appreciate.

I would like to remind members while using the boat ramp at the Marina to please lock the gate after launching or removing your boat. This is an important step to help us keep non-members off the lake. Keys for the gate are available in the office for \$3.

2024 DECALS

As soon as your 2024 Dues & Assessments are paid in full you can come into the office & pick up your 2024 decals.
2023 decals expire April 30, 2024.

Lot numbers and decals need to be present on ALL watercraft and slow moving vehicles.

This includes all non-motorized watercraft (kayaks, canoes, paddle-boards & paddle-boats).

You must bring your current watercraft registration and proof of \$300,000 liability insurance on the watercraft to receive your motorized watercraft decal.

Non-highway Vehicle decals are \$15 annually.

The state requires driver to have a valid driver's license and proof of minimum liability insurance coverage be carried within the vehicle.



BEACH AND SWIM SAFETY

Holiday Shores Regulations

- 1. Beaches located within the Association are restricted to members, associate members and their guests only.
- 2. Glass bottles, fires, pets and food are prohibited from the beach area.
- 3. Persons under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult 16 years of age or older.
- 4. Holishor Association Inc. is not responsible for one's personal items, nor any personal injury sustained while using Association facilities. (water, beach, grounds, etc.)
- 5. No swimming from sunset to sunrise in swimming areas

IL Dept. of Public Health Regulations

- 1. Beach water is not intended, nor fit, for human consumption. Do not swallow beach water
- 2. Beach admittance may be denied to individuals having:
- · Contagious diseases
- · Infections (foot infections, ear infections, vomiting, diarrhea, inflamed eyes, unhealed abrasions or lacerations, skin lesions, or bandages of any kind
- 3. Persons under the influence of alcohol or behaving erratically will be denied access/removed from the beach.
- 4. No food, drink, gum or tobacco products are permitted in the swim area.
- 5. The use of glass containers is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Children who are not toilet trained must wear tight fitting plasticized/rubber swim pants
- 7. Swimming alone is discouraged.
- 8. Diving in shallow water is prohibited.
- 9. Personal conduct that endangers the safety of ones' self, or other beach patrons, is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Swimming is permitted between sunrise and sunset, except during the times of thunder and/or lightening. Swimmers are required to exit the water during these conditions and remain out for a minimum of 30 minutes following the last detection of thunder or lightning.
- 11. Pets are prohibited from the beach area.
- 12. Beach patrons are not permitted to feed local wildlife or entice them to stay in the area. Wildlife harassment is also strictly prohibited.
- 13. Measures taken to protect ones' self from the sun, such as sunblock, beach umbrellas, etc. are strongly recommended.



Firefighter's Footnote

Firefighter's Footnote - You may have noticed some vehicles driving in Holiday Shores with blue lights – these are called courtesy lights. Volunteer firefighters in our community use them while on our way to our fire department in response to an emergency call. These courtesy lights are used to request a right-of-way to expedite our response in our privately owned vehicle to our firehouse/base, or occasionally directly to the scene of the emergency. If you are driving and see these lights in the car behind or approaching you, you are not required to move to the side of the road by law. However, it would be helpful if you did, so that the vehicle responding to the call can arrive more quickly to the department, and thereby more quickly to the site of the emergency. Some calls may turn out to be non-emergent but many times we are responding to a fire or medical emergency, so every second counts. Our quick response could mean the difference between a slight injury and severe disability, or between life and death. We appreciate your assistance in helping us reach the fire department more safely and quickly.

We mentioned in earlier articles that we will be holding several community involved events this coming year. Thank you to everyone who helped make our blood drive a success in March. This month, we are hosting a free Basic Life Support CPR/First Aid course on Saturday, May 11 from 9am-noon. You will learn how to perform CPR and use an AED. We will review First Aid tips and give you information to help you in multiple situations such as bee stings, choking, bleeding injuries, and many more areas. This is a great opportunity for babysitters and local employees. You never know who may need these life-saying skills someday! Here's what you can do if you observe something concerning:


- 1. Take Action: Record the license plate number and snap a photo of the car or individuals. This information is crucial for law enforcement and can deter suspicious activity.





New By Law Proposal - Subdividing of a Tract of Land

"The Holiday Shores Board of Directors will not have the sole authority to approve the subdividing of a Tract of land in Holiday Shores. However, in order for it to be placed on a ballot at the annual meeting the following guidelines must be met. These guidelines supersede any methods previously stated in the Community Instruments concerning the Changing or Addition of a Bylaw.

No land designated as a "tract" of land shall be allowed to be subdivided without the owner first getting the express written permission of the Holiday Shores Board of Directors to begin the process. In order for a "Tract" to be considered and voted on by the membership the following guidelines must be met.

- The Owner of the property must be a Member in Good Standing with Holiday Shores as defined in the Community Instruments.
- The area to be subdivided must be surveyed and must include streets, gutters and lot lines clearly marked by a licensed surveyor. Signed and sealed Platts must be provided to the board according to the schedule established for board review at a bi-monthly meeting.
- All Federal, State, IDNR, County, local governing bodies and Holiday Shores requirements must be met.
- The Platt must be approved by the legal counsel representing Holiday Shores.

The request will then be added to the agenda of the next annual meeting for a vote of the members. Approval by the Board of Directors simply allows it to be placed on the agenda.

To pass it will require a 66% yes vote from the membership of the association. The Board of Directors shall monitor the progress of the plan and have the right to revoke approval if it is determined the owner or developer is not adhering to all laws established by any legal governing body involved in the project to subdivide the tract. This Bylaw becomes effective upon passage at an annual meeting of the association."




