

### Manager's Report by Angie Webster



The lake draw-down began on September  $20^{th}$ . We are currently sitting at 4'4" below full pool. This depth will remain until December  $10^{th}$ . We sent out letters in August for seawall/dock repairs. There are quite a few that have not turned in building permits yet. Building Committee will be meeting the  $1^{st}$  and  $3^{rd}$  Tuesday in October and November. However, starting in December through March there will be only one per month.

You may have noticed some work going on at the Main beach. Wood seawall coming out and rip rap going in. We have made the walk-in beach area bigger. We will be doing some drainage work on Tamarach and the main beach.

Rip rap and soil cloth can be purchased through the Holishor Office. Rip Rap is \$40 a ton. Soil cloth \$4 per foot. Soil cloth is 15ft wide. Please call the office to set up amount, payment and delivery schedule.

The office is once again hosting the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Pet Food and Supplies Drive. November 1<sup>st</sup> through December 15<sup>th</sup>. All items received will be donated to The Metro East Humane Society. Items accepted include: dog/cat food, pet beds, toys, small blankets, and cleaning supplies. 



Our next meeting will be November 17, 2025 at 7:00 PM. The meeting program will be a presentation on herbs. You are always welcome to drop in for a meeting. Just come to the clubhouse ballroom at meeting time.

Our meeting September 15<sup>th</sup> was a field trip to Wood Acres Farm and Flowers in Bunker Hill. Whitney Vieths, who owns the farm with her husband, gave us a tour of her gardens. Since purchasing the farm which has been in her family for three generations, she has been developing larger and larger plots of sustainably grown flowers and herbs. She uses cover crops to keep weeds down and enrich the soil. In addition to selling flowers, Whitney does programs for children and classes on crafts and flower arranging. She also does fun programs of different types for any type of group. We were able to conduct our meeting and eat sack lunches in the barn as the sunset. It was a very good evening enjoyed by 15 members and two guests.

### **NOVEMBER GARDENING TIPS:**

- Plant spring blooming bulbs like daffodils and tulips now.
- Mulch around plants to protect them this winter and stake smaller trees and shrubs to prevent wind rock.
- Clean up outdoors by removing any annuals as they die off and clearing out weeds.
- Spread compost to improve soil in beds.
- Before the first frost, you may still have time to pot herbs like mint, oregano, basil, chives and parsley to bring indoors and grow near a sunny window.
- Clean and winterize yard and garden equipment. Roll up and store hoses, shut off outdoor water valves and winterize the lawn mower. Clean and oil hand tools for storage.

### **Shrimp Wonton Soup**

Servings: 4

### Wontons:

- 1/2 pound ground pork 1/2 pound Wild Caught Texas Shrimp, peeled, deveined, finely chopped
- scallions, thinly sliced
- 2-3 garlic cloves, minced
- teaspoon ginger, minced
- 1 teaspoon sesame oil
- 1 tablespoon soy sauce
- 1 teaspoon cornstarch
- 1 package square wonton wrappers

### Soup:

- 48 ounces chicken broth
- piece ginger (2 inches), grated
- tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 tablespoon dry white wine
- tablespoon sesame oil
- 1-2 baby bok choy

#### 1/2 pound Wild Caught Texas Shrimp, peeled and deveined 3 scallions, sliced

To make wontons: In large bowl, mix ground pork, shrimp, scallions, garlic, ginger, sesame oil, soy sauce, cornstarch, salt and pepper.

One wonton wrapper at a time, brush edges of two sides of wrapper with water. Add 1-2 teaspoons filling to center. Fold wrapper corner to corner so two wet edges meet two dry edges, creating triangle shape.

Press sides together to seal. Take two corners of triangle and join with water to create purse-like shape. Press to seal. Repeat with remaining wrappers and filling.

To make soup: In saucepan over high heat, stir broth, ginger, soy sauce, wine and sesame oil. Bring mixture

Cover pot and turn down heat, simmering 10-12 minutes. Add bok choy leaves, shrimp and scallions. Cook until shrimp are pink and heated through.

In separate saucepan, heat water to boil.

Drop in wontons in small batches and cook until floating, 5-7 minutes.

Transfer cooked wontons to bowls along with shrimp and bok choy from soup pot. Ladle broth, as desired,



Shrimp Wonton Soup



### **Shrimp Risotto**

Servings: 4

- 1 pound Wild Caught Texas Shrimp
- 2 cups arborio rice
- 1 teaspoon paprika salt
- pepper
- 8 cups broth
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 white onion
- 3 cloves garlic 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 1 cup grated Parmesan Italian parsley, for garnish

Peel and devein shrimp, leaving tails on. Rinse, pat dry and set aside.

Heat oven to 375 F.

Season shrimp with paprika, salt and pepper. Drizzle with olive oil then toss to combine.

Lay shrimp in single layer on baking sheet and refrigerate.

Heat medium saucepan over medium-low heat and add broth.

In separate deep, heavy-bottom pot, melt butter. Chop onion and garlic then add to pot and cook until soft and browning. Add arborio rice and stir to incorporate. Cook until fragrant, 1-2 minutes.

Add wine and cook, stirring, until alcohol smell evaporates. Add warm broth one ladle at a time, stirring consistently. Do not add another ladle until liquid from previous ladle is mostly soaked up by rice.

Risotto has finished cooking when rice is chewy with consistency of thick oatmeal.

### **September 10, 2025**

#### Call to Order

John Crotty called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m.

**Board Members in Attendance:** John Crotty, Jennifer Halverson, Ty Van Ryswyk, Ben Kelley, Tony Harris, Jim McCann, Trish Yates

**Association Office Present:** Angie Webster, Karla Suttles

**Approval of Minutes** 

**Tony Harris** *motioned* to approve the August 27, 2025 meeting minutes with the noted changes, **Jim McCann** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

**Transfers of Property** 

There were 2 transfers of property, both of which had an initiation fee. Membership is 1273.

**Bills & Salaries** 

**Ty Van Ryswyk** *motioned* to approve the bills & salaries, **Trish Yates** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report** 

**Profit & Loss Summary: Jim McCann:** We have collected 98.7% of our 2025 assessments and this typically is not that high. **Jennifer Halverson:** Do we know what funds may be available to spend by end of year? **Angie Webster:** Would like to address the sand on Tamarach and the main beach. **Tony Harris:** Noted that will also have to see how the sediment removal project goes and if additional funds will be needed to complete.

**Treasurer's report**: No questions presented.

Manager's Report & Code Enforcement Report

Angie Webster read the manager's report (which can be found published in full in the Holiday Times). John Crotty summarized the code enforcement report and noted 17 incidents reported last month, resulting in 25 citations written. Noted issues on the lake pertained to no wake, no lights, and careless operations. Property related incidents included signs and maintenance of properties. One derelict vehicle was reported and several building code reoccurring violations. Old Business

**Committee & Club Review** – The office has completed the committee and club assessment, verified all members are in good standing, and updated the list of chairs and members. The governance document will be sent to all groups.

**Restaurant Committee** – Final version of the contract has been shared with the board with no additional feedback. **Jim McCann** *motioned* to approve the restaurant lease as presented, **Ty Van Ryswyk** seconded, all in favor, motion passed. The contract will be reviewed by our attorney.

Associate Member Rule – Ben Kelley discussed the rule change with the Ski Club and recommends removing the note that excludes Associate Members. The club agrees participation should be first come, first serve. John Crotty: The Ski Club's request to allow Associate Members this year was approved, but there is concern a future board may not grant the same variance. Tony Harris: Agreed that if the rule is removed, it should remain that way and not change with each new Ski Club board. **Ty Van Ryswyk:** Understood the purpose to protect the Ski Club from Associate Members taking spots that should go to members first. **Jennifer Halverson:** Recalled the timing of this rule with the Ski Club's competition team to prevent Alton and St. Louis club members from joining and taking member spots. Dave Decker (1184): This rule was established when associate memberships were created. Removal of the rule would allow first come, first serve, but members should have priority over associates. It was put in place since the Ski Club is the only club with limited resources. Asked whether the Ski Club plans to set guidelines to ensure members retain priority if the rule is removed. **Trish Yates:** Would like for the protection to remain in place. **Tony Harris:** Before removing the Association rule, the board should review the Ski Club's governing documents. If those documents are updated to give members priority, the association rule change could be considered, and updates to the Ski Club's governing documents would require board approval. **Jennifer Halverson:** Recommended that this be addressed as a new change.

#### **New Business**

**Article V, Directors, Section 9 – Nominating Committee Bylaw Change** – Given the inability to secure volunteers for the last several years, this bylaw will be removed. The Committee will be established as needed going forward. **Jim McCann**: Noted that we do not want a bylaw that we would be in violation of and that cannot enforce. **Jim McCann** *motioned* to approve the proposed bylaw change for the annual meeting, **Tony Harris** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

HSBAR Modifications & Landscaping Addition – Two options were presented to address material storage and damage to Association roads. **Option 1:** Updates the introduction to state that materials may not be staged on Association or neighboring property, requires pre-project road pictures, adds a landscaping section with permit requirements, and establishes new infraction levels. **Option** 2: Updates the introduction to state that materials may not be staged on Association or neighboring property, without requiring pictures. It also includes the proposed new infraction levels. **Angie Webster:** Noted that most landscaping projects until recently have not been an issue with storing materials on the roads. Concerned that we do not have adequate staff for pictures. **Jennifer Halverson:** Asked for a paper trail after the verbal notification. **Angie Webster:** Recommended sending an email as the follow-up. Ty Van Ryswyk: Recommended that we work with the member and have them address the issue with the contractor. The member should be responsible for the contractor and their activity. **John Crotty:** Indicated that members should be aware of all documented rules regardless if a permit is required. Ray Garber (1822): Asked if a copy of the incident report could serve as the documentation and be given to the member. **Angie Webster:** Noted that the incident report is an internal document. Once processed, they get a warning or fine letter. Dave Decker (1184): Expressed concern that requiring a permit for landscaping work. Jim McCann: Indicated that we must have a rule to drive enforcement and protection of the roads. Noted a contractor that was a repeat offender. **Jennifer Halverson:** Asked how we would hold the contractor accountable for the repeat offenses. Tony Harris: Suggested that we add the ability to ban a contractor for more than just fines. Recommended that we clarify continued non-compliance and loss of membership rights. **Trish Yates:** Requested that requiring the member to fix the roads be added to option 2. Ty Van Ryswyk: Indicated that cost to repair the roads is important to recoup. Suggested sharing the rule update on all available sources. **Jennifer** Halverson: Summarized that ongoing non-compliance or unpaid damages will result in suspension of membership rights until resolved. Will make revisions and bring to the next meeting.

**Silt Removal Request from Members** – Members have asked if the association could provide a place to dump sediment. Currently, we are not allowing use of association property for this purpose. The member is on their own to remove sediment.



Ty Van Ryswyk *motioned* to approve the September 10, 2025 meeting minutes, Trish Yates seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

**Transfers of Property** 

There were 2 transfers of property, both of which had an initiation fee. Membership is 1273.

### **Old Business**

Restaurant Committee - Cleaning of the kitchen area has progressed, and preparations are complete for the new flooring. Three bids were received for epoxy flooring installation, which includes cleaning, patching, applying an epoxy with a flake finish, and polishing. The bids were as follows: Marciano Concrete for \$6,000, ToonCo Painting for \$5,445, and Central Epoxy Flooring for \$3,300. Board approval was requested to select a vendor so the office can proceed with the project and begin reinstalling equipment. **Angie Webster:** Noted that the epoxy system will extend a few inches up the wall (cove base) to eliminate the floor-towall seam and improve cleanability. She also reported that references for Central Epoxy Flooring were checked and that the vendor was recommended by a member of the Restaurant Committee. **Trish Yates**: Has personally used Central Epoxy and would recommend his work. **Tony Harris** motioned to approve the bid from Central Epoxy for \$3,300, **Ben Kelley** seconded, all in favor, motion passed. Associate Member Rule - A motion to approve was made on August 27 and the rule was posted for 4 weeks. No further discussion. All in favor, motion passed with an effective date of November 23, 2025.

#### **New Business**

HSBAR Introduction Rule Change — Staging of Materials — Revisions to the Building Rules are being proposed to address damages to the roads from staging of materials. Based on the prior meeting, the committee has taken the feedback into consideration and has a revised proposal. The addition includes: Materials and equipment may not be dumped, stored, or staged on Association roads, Association property, or another member's property without prior permission. Failure to comply will result in infractions under the Road/Material Storage Infraction Levels. Any damages to Association roads or property will be assessed by the Association, and the full cost of repairs will be billed to the member. Tony Harris motioned to approve the proposed rule change, Trish Yates seconded. The rule will be posted for 4 weeks before a final vote.

**HSBAR Infraction Level Addition** – A new infraction level is being proposed for staging of materials:

Road/Material Storage Infraction Levels

Upon notification, the member must correct the material storage issue within 24 hours, coordinating with the contractor as needed. A written notice will follow the initial notification via US mail or email.

If not corrected within 24 hours: a \$250 fine is assessed and membership rights are suspended. An additional \$250 fine will be assessed for each day of non-compliance until the materials are removed and compliance is verified. Membership rights remain suspended until compliance.

If road or property damage occurs: the Association will assess the cost of repairs and issue an invoice to the member. Failure to pay the invoice by the due date will result in suspension of membership rights until payment and any late fees are received in full.

**Tony Harris** motioned to approve the addition of the infraction fines to the

building rule, **Jim McCann** seconded. The rule will be posted for 4 weeks before a final vote.

**Bylaw Attachment 001** – Attachment 001 should be designated as Article XV in accordance with the recommended bylaw format outlined in Robert's Rules of Order. Typographical errors within the document were also corrected. **Tony Harris** *motioned* to approve the proposed bylaw change for the annual meeting, **Trish Yates** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

**Part 3** — **Rules, Lake, Shoreline Protection Rule Change** - A rule referencing Attachment 001 was updated to align with the newly designated Article XV. This change will become effective upon approval of the bylaw article renumbering at the 2026 Annual Meeting. **Tony Harris** *motioned* to approve the proposed article reference, **Trish Yates** seconded. The rule change will be posted for 4 weeks before final vote.

**HSBAR Variance (226)** – Member is requesting a 90-day extension to complete in-ground pool due to weather related delays. Target end of October to complete project. **Ty Van Ryswyk** *motioned* to approve the 90-day extension, **Jim McCann** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

**Excavator** – Angie would like to rent an excavator to work on the Joulters Creek, Holiday Point Parkway, plus other areas. Estimate is for \$1600 per week. Would like to rent for up to 4 weeks. **Tony Harris** *motioned* to approve rental of the excavator not to exceed \$7,000, **Ben Kelley** seconded, all in favor, motion passed. **Correspondence** 

**John Schulte (21)** - The member is requesting a boat decal for their Sea Ray 2003 boat, explaining that it was previously used at Holiday Shores and should have been grandfathered in, but they missed completing the form when it was offered. They explained that their prior 2002 model was the same length excluding the bolt-on swim platform, while the 2003 model has a molded platform counted in the measurement, causing the registration to list it as 23 ft. **Jim McCann:** Asked why there were no lot numbers or sticker on the boat if it had been on this lake in the past. John Schulte (21): Confirmed that there were lot numbers and a sticker on the boat but were removed when the boat was put on another lake for the last several years. Noted that he had the 2002 model and wanted a bigger motor so he ordered the 2023 not knowing that it was changed to the molded-in platform and that would put the documented length of the boat at 23 ft. Ty Van **Ryswyk**: Asked for confirmation that when he brought the registration to the office in 2003, he was given a sticker. John Schulte (21): Confirmed that he did receive a sticker. **Jim McCann**: Asked if there was any record of this in the office. **Angie Webster:** Confirmed that there is a letter on file that the boat is too long. Noted that she could not find any record of prior sticker issued for 2002 or 2003. The only boat on file was prior to 2000. John Schulte (21): Confirmed that he had a boat prior to the 2002. Indicated that he received a letter to complete a form for approval to grandfather the boat in and did not complete the paperwork. **Tony** Harris: Noted that even if the boat would have been grandfathered in, once it was removed from the lake, it cannot be brought back. Noted that the rules make note of grandfathering in boats prior to 1989 and this boat is newer. **Jim McCann**: Confirmed that this boat is not approved to be grandfathered since we do not have paperwork on file. John Crotty: Concluded that since this is registered as a 23 ft boat, it will not be approved.

**Garden Club** – The marquee on Prairietown Rd will be purchased by the Garden Club once the Association pours a concrete pad. Thank you to the Garden Club for this donation!

Last month we reviewed Fireground Management/ Reading Smoke and Auto Extrication. This month we will go over Ambulance Visit and Advanced Medical/ Pharmacology & Trauma. We responded to 22 calls over the past month: 12 EMS; 2 brush/vegetation fires; 2 assist invalid; 2 dispatched then canceled en route; and 1 each for MVA with pedestrian; MVA; Controlled burn; and CO activation. We received mutual aid twice from Meadowbrook and Prairietown Fire Departments and gave mutual aid once to Prairietown.

### **Holiday Shores Fire Protection District Hosts Regional Emergency Training**

On September 20, the Holiday Shores Fire Protection District led a large-scale emergency response training focused on school bus rescue and handling mass casualty situations. The four-hour exercise brought together over 35 participants from across the region—including fire departments, EMS teams, towing companies, and community volunteers. The goal was simple but vital: sharpen life-saving skills and build strong teamwork for complex emergencies.

The training simulated a serious school bus accident with multiple victims. Responders practiced fast-paced rescue techniques, triage, and coordination under realistic conditions. Fire departments from Meadowbrook, Prairietown, Hamel, and Dorsey took part, with essential support from Trickey's and Cross Towing, Arch Air Medivac, and Alton Memorial Ambulance. Volunteers from the SIUE John Martinson Honors Program played a key role by acting as injured passengers and helping with logistics.

Exercises like this help ensure that when real emergencies happen, our teams are ready to respond quickly and effectively. Working side-by-side with neighboring departments strengthens relationships and helps us provide the best care possible when seconds count.

Snow plowing and ice control begins when there is two inches of snow and more is expected or when ice begins to make the roads hazardous. Ice control material is applied to location an "as needed" basis. It takes 4-5 hours to plow the entire community with only two inches of snow.

Please drive with caution anytime winter precipitation are on the roads.

DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE TO SEE IF THE SNOW PLOWS ARE OUT OR TO REPORT SNOW - Heavy traffic hills and main roads are plowed first.

### What caution should I be aware of?

Clearance of driveway entrances is the responsibility of the resident. Plows may make several passes in order to widen the roads.

### What about mailboxes?

The truck will get as close to the mailboxes as possible.
It is the homeowner's responsibility to keep the area in front of the mailbox cleared. Keep mailboxes closed at all times.

### What about trashcans on pick up days?

Trashcans & recycle containers must be 4' off the road.

The snowplow drivers will not get out to move your containers and will not be responsible for damage.

### **USE CAUTION!!**

When maintenance is out on the roads, stay a safe distance behind the trucks. If you cannot see the mirrors on the trucks, they will not be able to see you.




