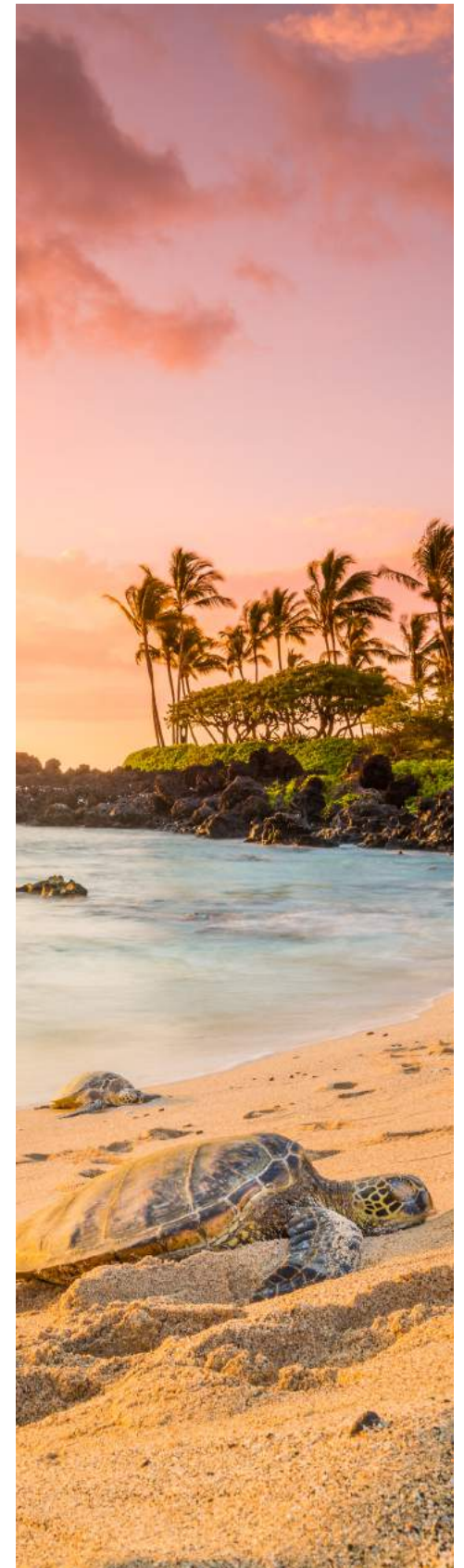

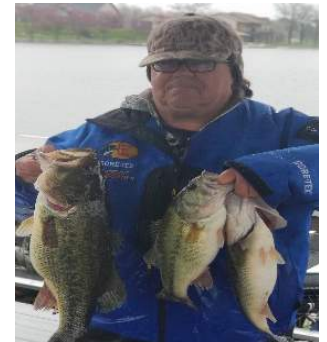
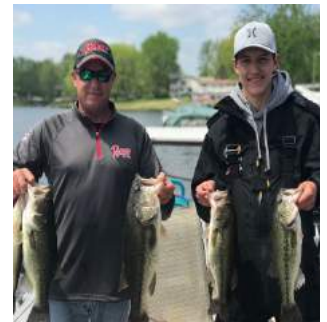

## Manager's Report *by Rob Clarkson*

The Community we reside in known as “Holiday Shores” is a Restricted Title Community. We are bound by our Community Instruments as are all future property owners of this Association. It is a good idea to read over these Instruments and be educated on the do’s and don’ts of our Community. You can find these on our website [www.holidayshores.us](http://www.holidayshores.us) or you can stop by the office and we will gladly give you a copy and answer any questions you may have at that time.

The Lake remains at full pool and our water quality is excellent. We will be heading into the official kick off of the boating season with a lake that is at full pool. I would like to remind everyone that boat stickers expired April 30th so be sure to get this year’s sticker and avoid any unwanted correspondence from my staff. I have already begun to receive complaints about boats creating a “Wake” in areas designated as “No Wake”. No Wake areas are marked by buoys either at the 75’ mark from the banks on Main Lake, at the entrance to No Wake coves, or at the designated No Wake sections of coves.

Please be respectful of this rule while boating so all can enjoy their time on the lake. We are currently seeking volunteers to watch the boat ramp gate on weekends starting May 25th. A friendly reminder to those launching their watercraft to secure the cable, checking of current decals, and an awareness to those that may be trying to use our lake and not pay dues is all that’s required.

There are 3 seats up for election for the Board of Directors. This volunteer position comes with many challenges. I would like to personally thank all that have volunteered their time to improve our community presently and in the past.

Along with the Su-Twan Dam project our Maintenance Dept will be hard at work re-surfacing roads and repairing the damage winter has brought upon the roads. If your road is scheduled to be chip and sealed, we will be putting notices on your door prior to the day it is scheduled. We would ask that you remove any vehicles that may be parked along the roadway and refrain from driving on the fresh oil



as we are completing the work. This work will be scheduled after normal morning business hours and to be completed by the close of normal business hours to lessen the inconvenience to our homeowners. Optimum time frame will be 9:00-4:30 Mon-Fri.

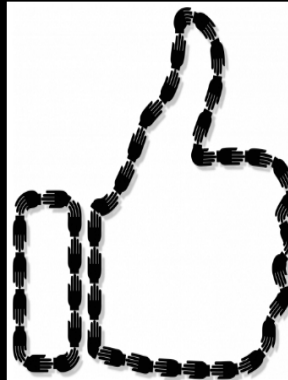

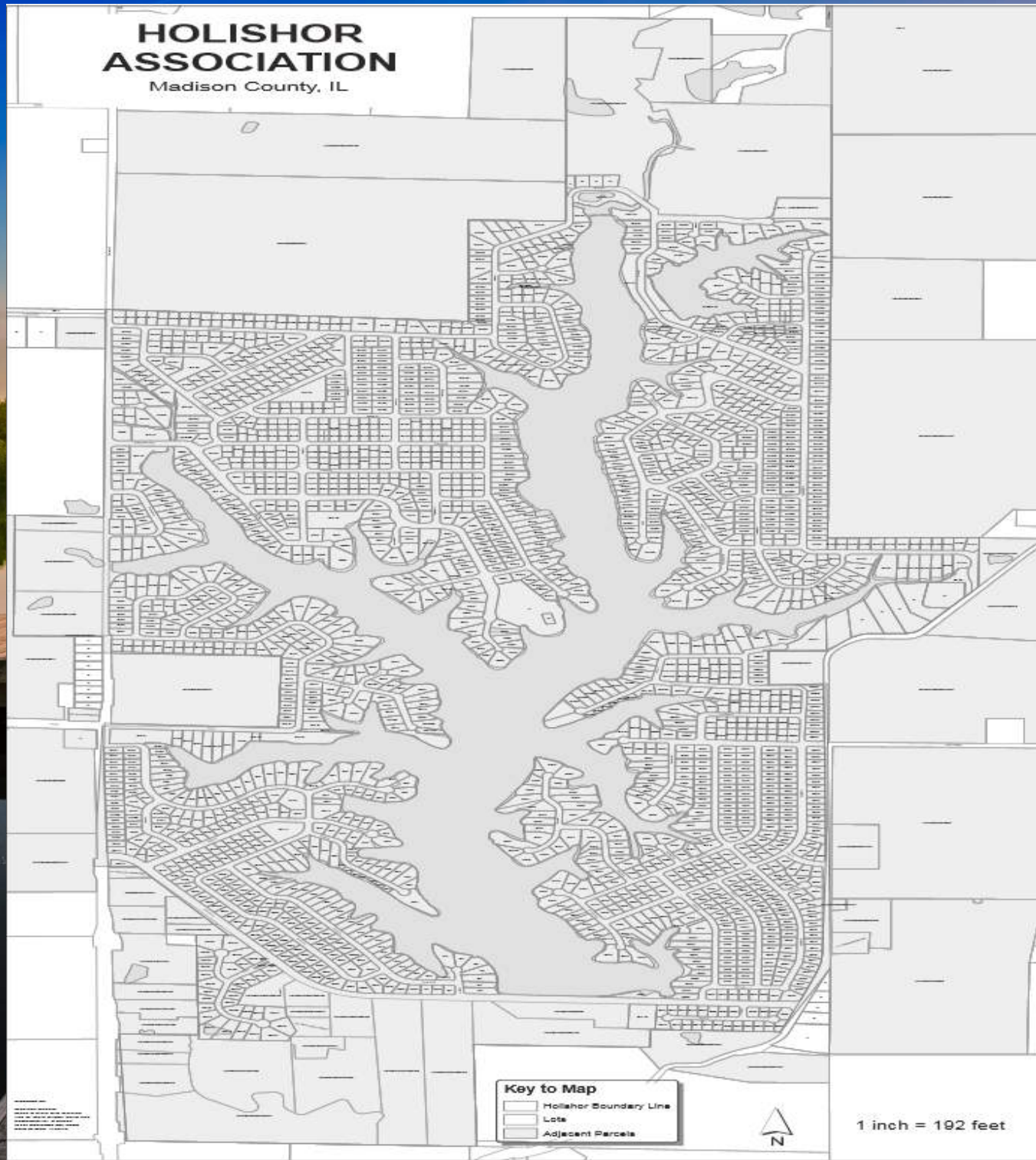

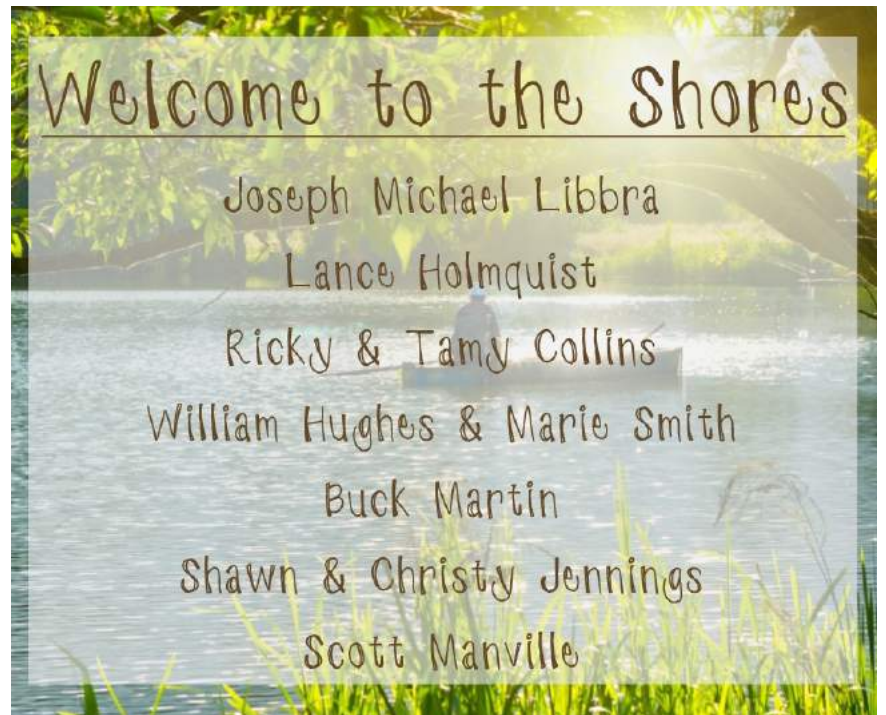

procedures we have in place. The review was pretty consistent to what we have seen in the past. I will read their opinions as this will also be read at the Annual Meeting by whoever is doing the finance report. In their opinion. For what you would see that as, that is considered a glowing approval. Basically, it says everything we should be doing, all the financial material is fairly stated. That is a good opinion. The other discussion that came out of our review is bad debts collected. As most of the Association knows by now, we have put in a collections policy and started taking people to court. In 2015, we collected \$25,000 in bad debt. In 2016, we collected \$61,000 in bad debt. In 2017, we collected \$58,000 in bad debt and last year we collected \$98,000. So last year we collected 10% of our annual budget in bad debt. That is pretty significant and I think that is a great testament to the policies and procedures we have put in place so this is all good news.

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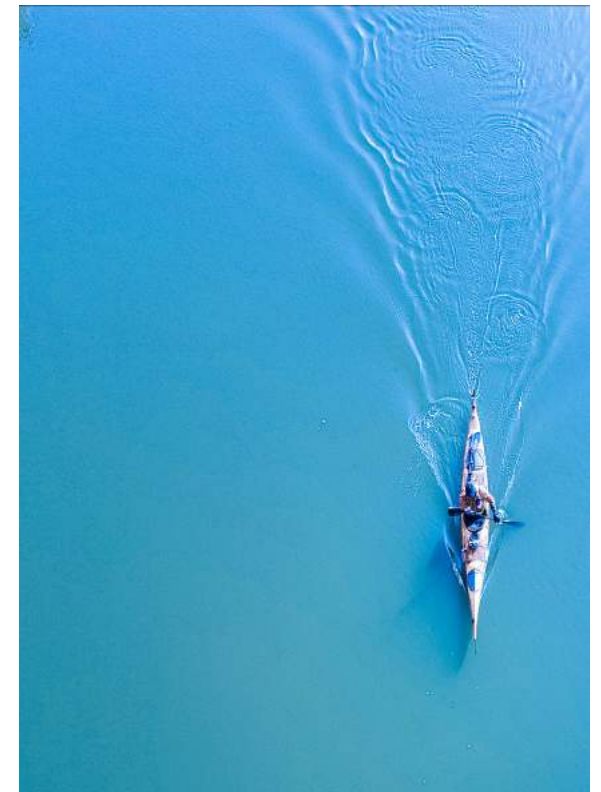

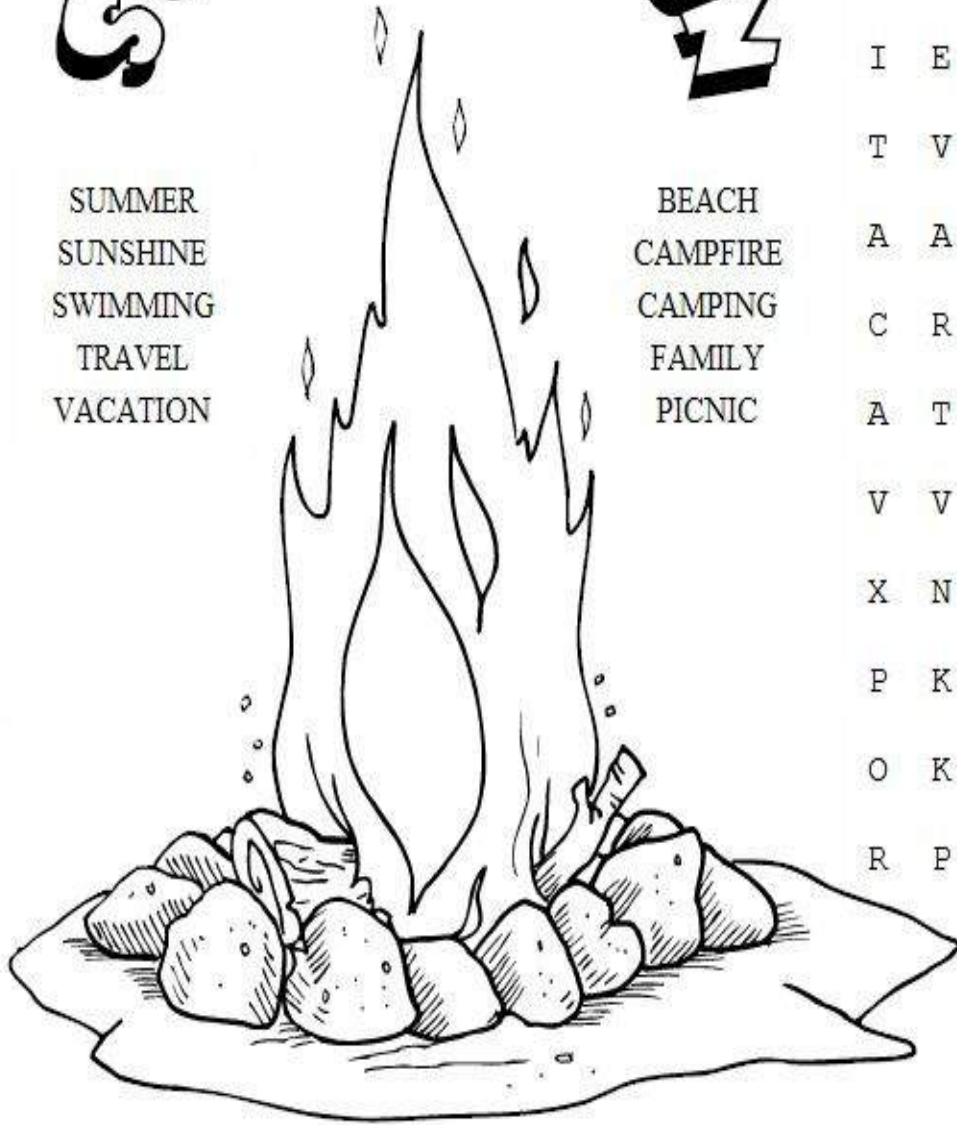

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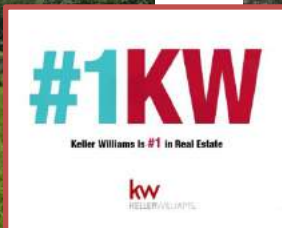

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# Medic Minute – Bike Safety

Riding a bike that is the right size for you helps keep you safe. Adjust your bicycle to fit: Stand over your bicycle; if you have a road bike, there should be 1-2 inches between you and the top bar, and add 3-4 inches if using a mountain bike; the seat should be level from front to back; the seat height should be adjusted to allow a slight bend at the knee when the leg is fully extended; the handlebar height should be at the same level with the seat. Rules of the road are: Go with the flow, not against it - always ride on the right side of the road in the same direction as other vehicles. Yield to traffic when appropriate - slow down at driveways, sidewalks, bike paths, etc and look to see if the way is clear before proceeding. This also means yielding to pedestrians who have already entered a crosswalk. Obey all traffic laws and be predictable – ride in a straight line, not in and out of cars, signal your moves to others, stay alert at all times, watch out for potholes, cracks, or anything that could make you lose control of your bike. Don't wear a headset when riding – you need to hear traffic and avoid dangerous situations. Look before turning – always look behind you for a break in

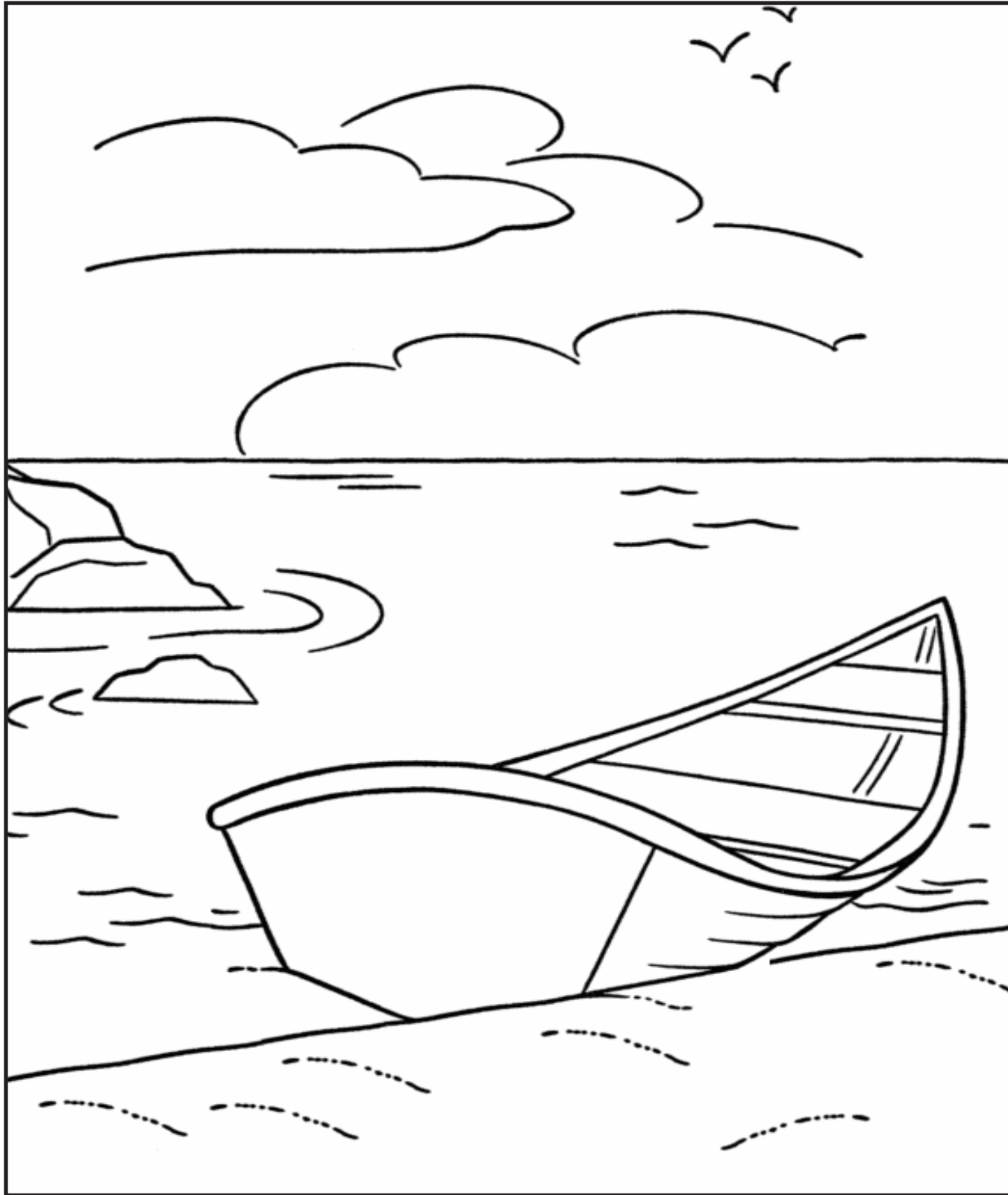
traffic then signal before turning and watch for left or right-turning traffic. Watch for parked cars and be prepared for the unexpected such as opening doors or cars pulling out. Control your bicycle – always ride with at least one hand on the handlebars, carry books and other items in a bicycle carrier or backpack. See and be seen – wear neon, fluorescent or other bright colors to make you more visible, also wear something that reflects light such as reflective tape or flashing lights. Also make

sure you have reflectors on the front and rear of your bicycle as well as on your tires so others can see you. Remember a bicycle is a vehicle and you're a driver.

Always wear a helmet – studies have shown that wearing a helmet can reduce your risk of a head injury by as much as 85 percent and a serious brain injury by 88 percent, since during a fall or collision, most of the impact injury is absorbed by the helmet rather than just your head. More children ages 5-14

go to hospital emergency rooms for injuries associated with bicycles than with any other sport, and many of these injuries involve the head. Make sure the helmet sits well and doesn't rock side to side. It should sit level on your head and low on your forehead – one or two fingers above your eyebrows. Center the left buckle under the chin. Adjust the slider on both side straps to form a "V" under and slightly in front of the ears; lock them if possible. Buckle the chin strap and tighten it until snug so that no more than one or two fingers fit under the strap. Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash or is damaged. Buy a helmet that fits your head now and not a helmet to "grow into"; replace one that has been outgrown.







# BEACH AND SWIM SAFETY

## HOLIDAY SHORES REGULATIONS

1. Beaches located within the Association are restricted to members and guests only.
2. Glass bottles, fires, pets and food are prohibited from the beach area.
3. Persons under the age of 16 are allowed swim: if being escorted by an individual 17 years of age or older or there is a lifeguard on duty.
4. During each shift, a lifeguard is allowed a ten-minute break every hour, during that time, swimmers must exit the water.
5. Holishor Association Inc. is not responsible for one's personal items, nor any personal injury sustained while using Association facilities (water, beach, grounds, etc.)

## IL DEPT. OF PUBLIC HEALTH REGULATIONS

1. Beach water is not intended, nor fit, for human consumption. Do not swallow beach water.
2. Beach admittance may be denied to individuals having:
  - Contagious diseases
  - Infections (foot infections, ear infections, vomiting, diarrhea, inflamed eyes, unhealed abrasions or lacerations, skin lesions, or bandages of any kind.
3. Persons under the influence of alcohol or behaving erratically will be denied access/removed from the beach.
4. No food, drink, gum or tobacco products are permitted in the swim area.
5. The use of glass containers is strictly prohibited.
6. Children who are not toilet trained must wear tight fitting plasticized/rubber swim pants.
7. Swimming alone is discouraged.
8. Diving in shallow water is prohibited.
9. Personal conduct that endangers the safety of ones' self, or other beach patrons, is strictly prohibited.
10. Swimming is permitted between sunrise and sunset, except during the times of thunder and/or lightening. Swimmers are required to exit the water during these conditions and remain out for a minimum of 15 minutes following the last detection of thunder or lightening.
11. Pets are prohibited from the beach area.
12. Beach patrons are not permitted to feed local wildlife or entice them to stay in the area. Wildlife harassment is also strictly prohibited.
13. Measures taken to protect ones' self from the sun, such as sunblock, beach umbrellas, etc. are strongly recommended.

# BOATING RULES

**Legal Compliance** – “All watercraft operated on Holishor Association Lakes must adhere to and comply with state and federal laws as stated in the Illinois Registration and Safety Act.”

**Speed Limit** – “The maximum speed of any watercraft operated on Holiday Lake shall be 55mph or as defined in the Reckless or Careless Operation section of the Holiday Shores Boating Rules. Operation of said watercraft shall be in a manner that does not create an exaggerated wake. Intentionally ‘plowing’ or ‘pushing water’ at speeds greater than no-wake, but less than those typically maintained while ‘on plane’ is not permitted.”

**Watercraft/Registration** – “All watercraft being operated on Holiday and Su Twan Lakes must have a current state registration decal and numbers, one/current Holiday Shores decal, and lot numbers affixed.”

**Operating Age** – The minimum age to operate watercraft on Holiday Lake is 12, providing the individual has passed a state certified boater safety class. Individuals between the ages of 12 and 18 must possess a valid boater safety card to operate watercraft, unless under the direct supervision of a member or a person over the age of 18, who has member consent.

**Watercraft Limit** – No member shall have more than three motorized watercraft registered to the same membership in operation at one time.

**Size Limit** – All watercraft being operated on Holiday Lake except pontoon boats with tubular bottoms, are limited to 22 feet in length. Pontoons are restricted to 28 feet.

**Traffic Pattern** – All watercraft being operated on Holiday Lake must follow a counterclockwise direction of travel, similar to that of operating a motor vehicle on the roadway.

**Boating Hours** – Boating on Holiday and Su Twan Lakes is permitted 24 hours a day, but watercraft are restricted to No-Wake speeds from sunset to sunrise.

**Noise Level Limit** – No watercraft may be operated on Holiday or Su Twan Lakes in a manner that exceeds a noise level of 75 decibels. This restriction includes inboard/outboard motors, stereos, etc.

**Restricted Areas** – No watercraft shall be operated in any manner except prescribed for areas marked No-Wake, Swimming Area, etc. Holiday Lake is considered No-Wake when the lake reaches 9” above full pool and 16” below full pool.

**Reckless or Careless Operation** – Careless: No watercraft shall be operated in a manner that puts any person or property in danger or at a rate of speed that prohibits the driver from stopping the craft within a safe distance. Reckless: No watercraft shall be operated in a manner that willfully and wantonly puts life, limb, or property of another person in danger. This restriction applies to actions such as weaving through traffic, jumping wake when visibility is obstructed, following too close to skiers, playing ‘chicken’, or passing another craft in a manner that produces a hazardous wake/wash. This restriction also applies to the misuse of water skis, wake boards, or other devices.

**Water Skiing** – Water skiers, wake boarders, tubers, etc. may not be towed without at least two competent persons in the tow boat, to observe the individual(s) being towed and provide assistance if distressed/injured.

**Distance** – Operators must keep a safe and reasonable distance between their craft and other lake users, such as swimmers, downed skiers, fishermen, etc. They must also maintain a distance of 75ft from shore when making a wake. Seventy-five-foot markers have been replaced with new, larger white/blue buoys.

**Orange Flag** – Operators are required to display a bright orange flag on their vessel any time they have a skier, tuber, wake boarder, etc. in the water. The flag must be a 12 inch by 12 inch square and affixed to the highest point of the craft, such as a ski tower or pontoon top.

**Racing** – Racing of any watercraft on Holiday or Su Twan Lakes is prohibited.

**Power Turns** – Power Turns (also referred to as 180s or 360s) are permitted as long as the following criteria are met: 1.) Craft is not unreasonably close to another craft, causing it to swerve or take evasive action to avoid a collision. 2.) Not done in a manner that causes the driver and/or passengers to be thrown from the craft. 3.) Not done in a cove or in a manner which causes a nuisance to another member.

**Engine Cut-Off** – All watercraft (prop-driven and PWC’s) equipped with an engine cut-off device may not be operated unless the device is properly functioning and it’s lanyard is securely attached to the driver.
