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

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Manager's Report by Angie Webster



Winter is here, with winter, comes snow removal. The most recent storm, dumped about 12 inches total on the Shores. I asked that residents keep vehicles, trailers, and such off the roadways, this makes clearing roads much easier. After any 2" snowfall we will be clearing and treating roads according to schedule. That schedule is in the Holiday Times and on our website.

The North End excavation project is complete. A total of 16,800 cubic yards has been removed from the lake. We know this project has caused road damage, and property damage on the edges of resident properties. Please know repairs will be made to return residents' properties back to normal. Road repairs will continue as needed until we are able to permanently fix in the spring. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to me in office ext. 1

As of today the gate for draw-down will remain shut and we look forward to the lake filling up for the boating season ahead.

You may have noticed that we are also digging out Joulters creek and Holiday Point Parkway creek. We are hoping this will slow the flow of water and silt into the lake. Rip rap will be added to both creek sides as well as the retention pond where Joulters Creek comes in under the road to prevent further erosion. This work is not complete and will continue as weather allows.

By now you should have received your Annual Statement. If you did not receive yours, please call the office and we will get another out to you. Dues and Assessments are due January 1st - late fees post on the 11th of each month. 2026 Watercraft and SMV stickers have arrived. They are yellow this year. Once your membership fees are paid in full, please bring your proof of \$300K watercraft liability insurance and watercraft registration to the office to obtain your stickers. Keep in mind that Associate Member Cards expire on December 31st each year. For members who may have difficulty staying current with this requirement, please reach out to myself or Stefani to discuss ways we can help.

The 12th Annual Pet Food and Supplies Drive is under way. Thank you to those who have already donated. We will be collecting through December 15th. All items will be donated to the Metro East Humane Society. For a complete list of supplies needed visit their website at www.mehs.org/supplies. 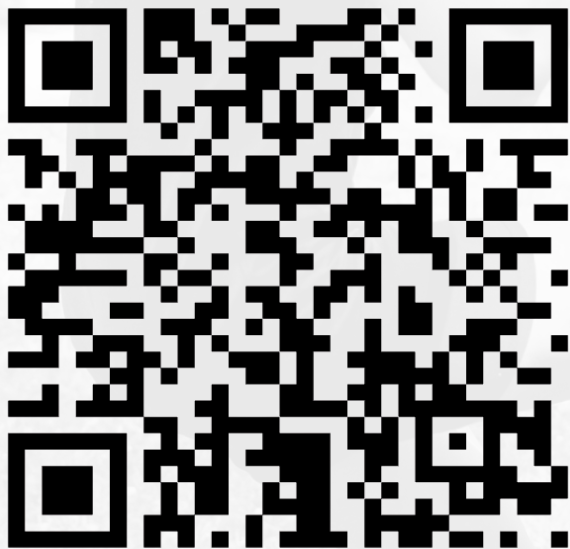

Happy New Year! We hope everyone had a very Merry Christmas and a Happy Holiday season. Why not start the New Year with a new resolution to join our family at Holiday Shores Volunteer Fire Department? You can serve your community by donating time each month to learning new skills that will help others in their time of need. No previous experience necessary. We will teach you everything you need to know, through hands-on training, classroom education, and e-learning. There are many levels available from auxiliary to firefighter. You can help out at the department, run the radio, answer medical calls, or fight fires. There's something for everyone!

Over the last couple months, we reviewed HazMat scenario responses, went over our Region IV guidelines, and familiarized ourselves with the ambulances. The New Year means we will begin our training again so that we can stay prepared to respond to any and all situa-

tions. I will have the stats next month for how many runs we made in 2025. Any guesses? Last month we responded to 28 calls: 18 EMS; 3 Assist Invalids; 2 False Alarms; 2 Dispatched & Canceled; 2 Brush Fires; and 1 CO detector activation. We gave mutual aid once to Meadowbrook.



Saturday, January 24 is a CPR class here at the fire department from 9am to 1pm through the American Heart Association. It is open to the public, it's easy, and it's free! It's a great class to take whether it is for the first time, recertifying, needed for work, for babysitters, or if you just want to learn how to respond in an emergency. What you learn can help you can save someone's life. We hope to see you here. Come by the department any Monday evening from 7-9pm to speak with us about becoming a member of our team. Holiday Shores Members,

Happy New Year Holiday Shores from the Holiday Shores Fishing Committee.
We hope everyone had a Merry Christmas and good New Year.

A little Recap of 2025 for our lake:

Throughout the year 10,106 crappie were reported as being removed. Thank you to everyone who helped thin out the crappie population. When we started removing these overabundant fish from the lake they averaged 6-7 inches and are now averaging approximately 8-9 inches. We are making progress!!! There is still no limit on the Crappie for 2026 (pending approval of the HS Board of Directors). We will go to the Board annually with recommendations on cull limits. As a committee, we would like to remove the "no limit" rule once we start to see a 10-inch average.

This spring we will host another Crappie tournament like we did a few years back with hourly weigh ins for a chance to win some nice prizes. If anyone would like to sponsor an hourly weigh-in please contact the Fishing Committee.

Hybrid Stripers were stocked in in the lake in the Fall of 2024 and the Spring of 2025. When they stocked into the lake, they averaged 6-8 inches in length. We are getting reports from several anglers catching them and they are now between 12-15 inches. Remember they must be 20 inches to keep and the limit is 1 per person per day.

Last but not least, we will be hosting another Raffle with 10 awesome prizes. Stay tuned - we will start selling Tickets in February.

Skillet Chili Mac

Cook time: 15 minutes

Servings: 10

- 1 pound ground beef
 1 cup chopped onion
 1 can (14 ounces) crushed tomatoes
 1 tablespoon chili powder
 1 teaspoon cumin
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 2 cups elbow macaroni (8 ounces), cooked and drained
 1 package (2 cups) Borden Cheese Thick Cut Four Cheese Mexican Shreds, divided
 1 package (2 cups) Borden Cheese Sharp Cheddar Shreds, divided
 2 green onions, thinly sliced
 2 tablespoons chopped cilantro



In large skillet over medium heat, cook ground beef and onion 5-7 minutes, or until meat is browned, stirring occasionally. Drain fat, if necessary.

Stir in tomatoes, chili powder, cumin and salt. Stir in cooked macaroni; reduce heat to medium-low.

Whole milk is not associated with higher obesity rates. Multiple large-scale studies from “The American Journal of Clinical Nutrition,” the “International Journal

of Obesity” and “Preventive Medicine Reports” show children who drink whole milk have lower or similar body fat levels compared to those drinking reduced-fat milk.

Whole milk does not increase risk of heart disease.

According to “Advances in Nutrition,” whole milk does not increase cardiometabolic risk in kids; in fact, it’s associated with better vitamin D levels with no adverse effects on cholesterol or glucose.

Adults may benefit, too. Among adults, full-fat dairy is associated with greater satiety, improved blood sugar regulation and a reduced risk of metabolic syndrome, according to a study published in “Nutrition & Metabolism,” helping reframe full-fat dairy as part of a balanced diet.

Homemade Cream of Tomato Soup

Prep time: 10 minutes

Cook time: 20 minutes

Servings: 4

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/2 medium white onion, chopped
- 1 1/2 teaspoons finely chopped garlic
- 1 can (28 ounces) crushed tomatoes
- 1 tablespoon parsley flakes
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 tablespoon roughly chopped fresh basil leaves
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 2-3 cups milk
- salt, to taste
- pepper, to taste
- basil leaves, for garnish (optional)

In 2-quart saucepan over medium-high heat, heat olive oil; add onion and garlic. Cook, stirring occasionally, until tender, 2-3 minutes. Add tomatoes, parsley and baking soda. Cook until mixture comes to boil. Reduce heat to medium-low; cook 10 minutes. Stir in basil and honey.

Stir in milk to reach desired consistency. Cook over medium-high heat until heated through, 2-3 minutes. Add salt and pepper, to taste.

Garnish with basil leaves, if desired.



Breakfast Cookies

Prep time: 20 minutes

Cook time: 15 minutes

Servings: 12

Cookie Base:

- 2 1/2 cups old-fashioned oats
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup butter, melted
- 1/2 cup whole milk
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Heat oven to 350 F. Line cookie sheets with parchment paper; set aside.

In large bowl, stir oats, flour, brown sugar, baking powder and salt. In medium bowl, stir butter, milk, egg and vanilla until well mixed; add to oat mixture. Stir until combined and evenly moistened.

Drop 1/4 cup dough onto prepared cookie sheets. Slightly flatten dough with hand.

Bake 15-17 minutes, or until lightly browned, firm to touch and baked through. Move to wire rack to cool.

Variations: Add maple syrup and crumbled bacon; sliced almonds, dried cherries and almond extract; semisweet chocolate chips and banana pieces; or peanuts and peanut butter.



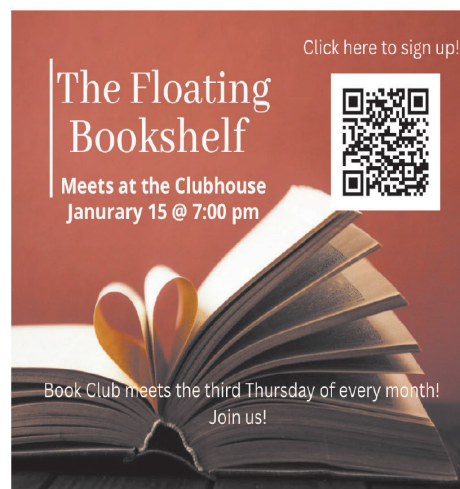

2026 decals are yellow . Bring in a copy of your registration and proof of \$300,000 watercraft liability insurance (for motorized boats) as soon as your 2026 Dues & Assessments are paid in full. There are four types of decals: motorized, non-motorized (kayaks, paddle-boards, canoes etc), PWC's and non-highway vehicles (golf carts, side-by-sides etc.) Non-highway vehicles decals are \$15.00.

2025 decals expire on April 30, 2026. Watercraft in the water or on lifts are required to have 2026 decals by May 1.

Associate member cards expire December 31, 2025.

November 12, 2025

Call to Order

John Crotty called the meeting to order at 7:36 p.m.

- **Association Office Present:** Angie Webster, Karla Suttles
- **Members Present:** 3
- **Non-members in attendance:** 1
- **Board Members Excused:**

Pledge of Allegiance recited.

Approval of Minutes

- **Tony Harris** *motioned* to approve the October 8, 2025 meeting minutes, **Trish Yates** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

Transfers of Property

There were 8 transfers of property, all of which had initiation fees. Membership is 1274.

Bills & Salaries

Tony Harris *motioned* to approve the bills & salaries, **Ty Van Ryswyk** seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report

Profit & Loss Summary: No questions presented.

Treasurer's report: Tony Harris noted that one of the CDARs account is maturing this month. Rather than renewing it for one year, the Finance Committee recommends a six-month renewal to allow the Board to revisit investment options, potentially using a brokerage firm, following the next annual meeting. Tony Harris *motioned* to reinvest the funds from the CDARs account that is maturing and a 26-week CD with an interest rate of 3.75%, Trish Yates seconded, all in favor, motion passed.

Manager's Report & Code Enforcement Report

Angie Webster read the manager's report (which can be found published in full in the Holiday Times).

John Crotty summarized the code enforcement report and noted 12 incidents reported last month, resulting in 27 citations written. Recurring issues include building violations, property maintenance, and boating violations.

Old Business

Restaurant Committee Update – The new tile and wall updates in the restaurant space are complete. The space has now been shown to five potential operators, narrowed down from an initial eight to ten inquiries. Two interviews were held this week, and while names cannot yet be shared, interest looks promising. Because the restaurant is in a special use area and a liquor license takes three to four months to obtain, the goal is to bring a proposal to the Board in December or January, with the intent of opening a restaurant by April.

Part 3-Rules, Lake, Shoreline Protection Rule Change Vote – This rule change will update Attachment 001, renamed to article 15, provided the bylaw changes is approved on May 16. All in favor, *motion* passed with an effective date of May 16, 2026 provided the bylaw is approved.

HSBAR Introduction Rule Change Vote – Revisions to the Building Rules are being proposed to address damages to the roads from staging of materials. All in favor, *motion* passed with an effective date of January 11, 2026.

HSBAR Road Material Storage Infraction Level Addition Vote – A new infraction level is being proposed for staging of materials. All in favor, *motion* passed with an effective date of January 11, 2026.

New Business

Backhoe Repair Approval – The backhoe requires repair with an estimate of \$5,880.10. This was approved via an emergency board approval on October 27, 2025. **Jim McCann** *motioned* to approve the repairs for \$5,880.10, **Ben Kelley** seconded, Jennifer Halverson and Tony Harris also approved, motion passed.

North Property Erosion Estimate – The North End creek area is experiencing erosion along the outer wall, and the slope is too steep for the maintenance crew to complete the needed rip rap work. The proposal is to regrade the area to

provide a step-down slope which will decrease erosion. There are two bids for the project: Pro X for \$22,400 and SES for \$13,135. **Ty Van Ryswyk** *motioned* to approve the bid for \$13,135, **Ben Kelley** seconded, motion passed with 6 ayes and 1 nay. **Jim McCann** expressed concern with putting another project on SES given the potential delays in the current sediment removal project.

HSBAR Variance (7160) – Building plans submitted included a crawl space, which is compliant with our building standards. Builder poured a monolithic slab. Member and contractor were advised on October 23 that the building was not in compliance. Building did not stop until November 4. Member is asking for a variance to continue building without the crawl space. **Brad Greer (7160):** Reviewed the issue with Madison County building inspector, and he had suggested that we request the variance. **Tony Harris:** Noted that the builder, who is familiar with our rules, chose not to follow the approved plan. **Brad Greer (7160):** Acknowledged the seriousness of the issue, noting he had focused on finances rather than construction oversight and now recognizes the need for closer management. He noted that his son is assisting since he no longer lives in the area. **Jim McCann:** Reiterated that we do not allow slab homes and to come up with a way to add a crawl space. Noted that the home where framing has started will have to be taken down. **Heath Greer:** Explained that the Madison County inspector has approved two options: removing the current framing and adding three rows of block, or building a treated-lumber crawl space of the same height. Either option will be accepted and will result in a standard crawl space with sub-floor above. **Ty Van Ryswyk:** Does not support granting a variance for a slab and believes a crawl space is required. He is open to either of the two approved crawl-space options and would allow the owner to choose between them. *Requested that building plans be revised to show how the crawl space will be added and submit to the building committee. The variance request is denied due to a lack of motion.* **HSBAR Variance (7164)** - Building plans submitted included a crawl space, which is compliant with our building standards. Builder poured a monolithic slab. Member and contractor were advised on October 23 that the building was not in compliance. Building did not stop until November 4. Member is asking for a variance to continue building without the crawl space. *The above discussion applies to this variance request.*

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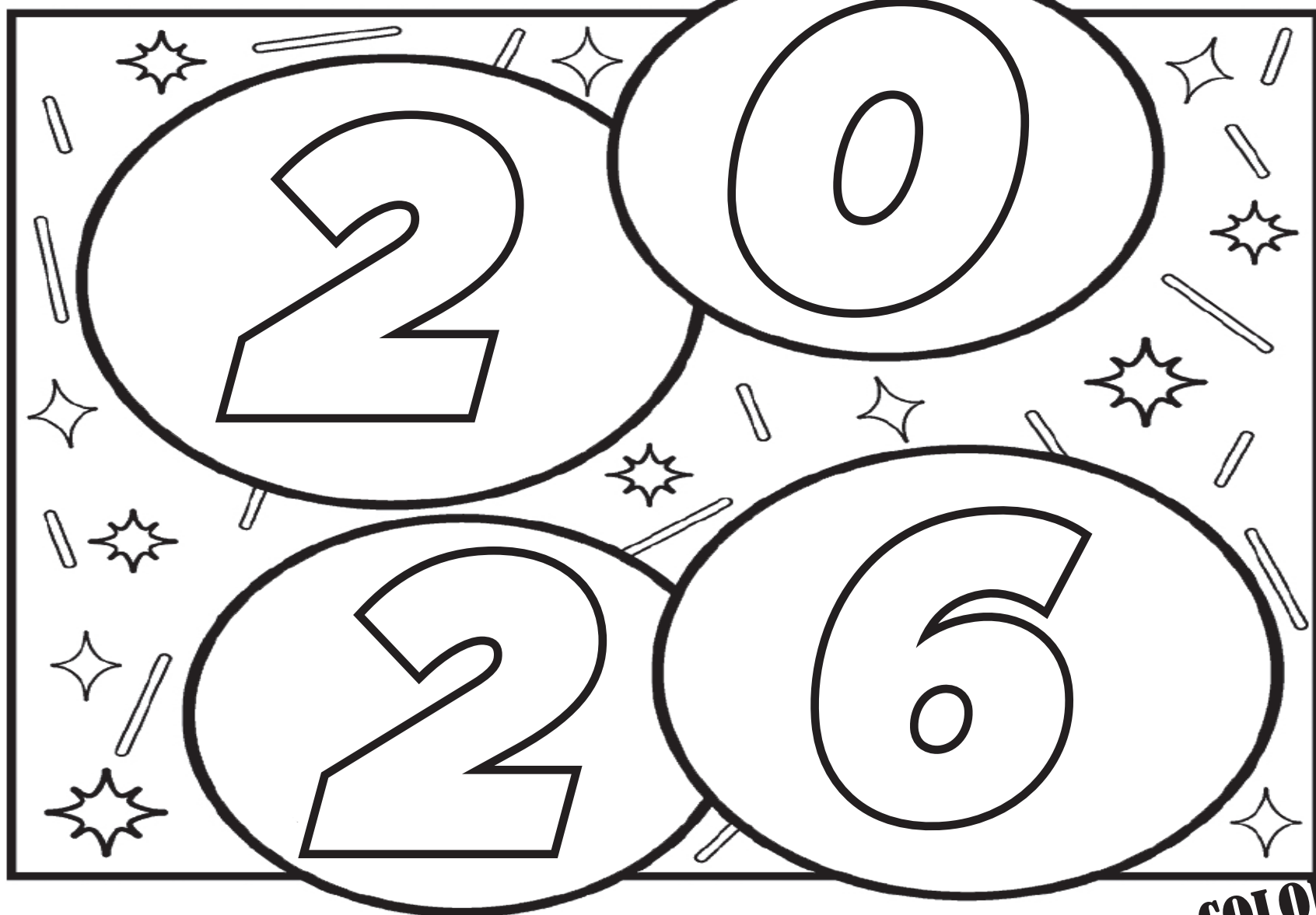
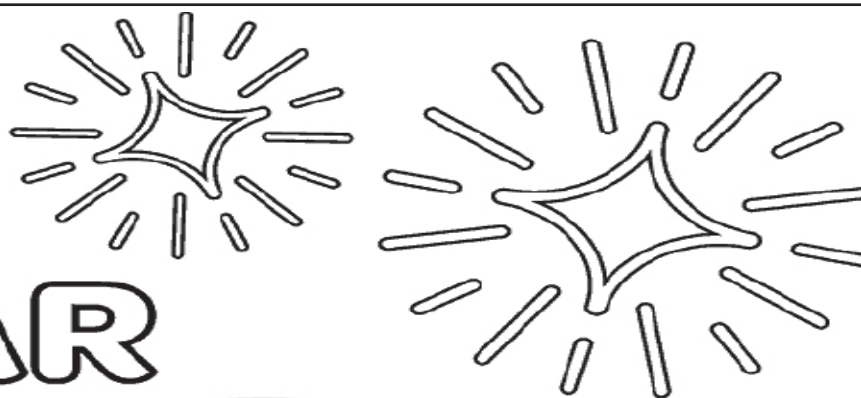

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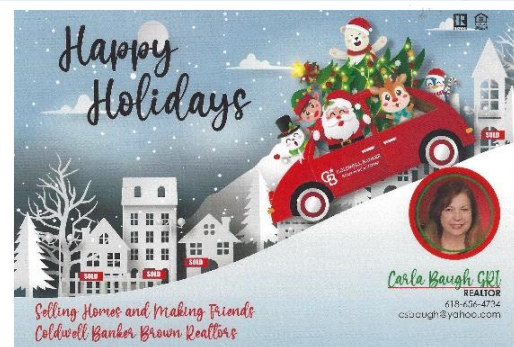

Snow plowing and ice control begins when there is two inches of snow and more is expected or when ice begins to make the roads hazardous. Ice control material is applied to location on an "as needed" basis. It takes 4-5 hours to plow the entire community with only two inches of snow.

What caution should I be aware of?

What about mailboxes?

The truck will get as close to the mailboxes as possible. It is the homeowner's responsibility to keep the area in front of the mailbox cleared. Keep mailboxes closed at all times.

What about trashcans on pick up days?

Trashcans & recycle containers must be 4' off the road. The snowplow drivers will not get out to move your containers and will not be responsible for damage.

If you cannot see the mirrors on the trucks, they will not be able to see you.**

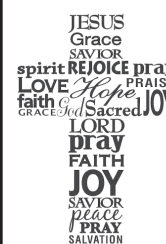
