

**ABOUT BOATING SAFELY -** We invite you to take the About Boating Safety course with instruction by Flotilla 34. This exciting, in-depth boating safety course will give you the knowledge to enhance your boating experience. It will cover general boating terms, boating laws and regulations, boating equipment, navigation rules, operating your vessel safely, anchoring, personal watercraft and so much more. The boating class will give you the knowledge needed to obtain a boating license or safety certificate. Persons born on or after January 1, 1998, may operate a vessel powered by a motor of more than 10 horsepower (hp) **only** if they have a valid Boating Safety Certificate accepted by the Department of Natural Resources. Many boat insurance companies will offer discounts on boating insurance to boaters who successfully complete the About Boating Safely course.

**DATES, TIME, LOCATION -** The course will be presented in two, four-hour morning sessions, from 9am to 1pm on Saturday and Sunday, March 4 & 5 at the Holiday Shores Clubhouse. Participants are welcomed and encouraged to bring a snack.

**MATERIALS AND COSTS** - The About Boating Safely book is a full-color, 68 page text book and study guide. A \$20 fee includes the book, Boating Safely certificate, Boating Safely wallet card and end of course exam. A \$5 fee for each additional family member that will use the book includes the Boating Safely certificate, wallet car and exam.

The Holiday Shores Garden Club celebrated the holidays and closed out the year in December with their annual holiday party. Meetings are not held in the months of January, February or March, but that doesn't mean there is no gardening activity those months. Follow these tips to protect your landscaping this winter and be ready for spring.

Heavy snow on trees and shrubs, especially evergreens can lead to breakage. Brush off snow carefully before it melts and refreezes and is difficult to remove. Allow ice to melt off naturally. Icy branches are brittle and can break easily.





Use sand, bird seed, sawdust or vermiculite to gain traction on icy paths and drives. Avoid salt or ice melt that may injure plants. Avoid walking on frozen lawns as this may injure turf grass. Hanging suet cakes in trees will attract insect-eating woodpeckers to your yard.

If overwintering dormant tender perennials or tropical plants in a basement or garage monitor the temperature and moisture levels closely to avoid freezing, drying out or rotting. You should also check any stored bulbs for signs of drying out or rotting.

Seed and nursery catalogs arrive. While considering purchases, look for plants with improved insect and disease resistence or drought-tolerance. If you have old seeds, try sprouting a test sample before ordering new seeds. Roll up 10 seeds in a damp paper towel and keep warm and moist. If over half sprout in a week, they can still be used this year. If not, order fresh seed.

### Chicken and Peppers Pasta

3 bell peppers (variety of green, orange, yellow or red)

1 white onion, diced

2 pounds cooked chicken breasts, diced

1 jar Tomato and Basil sauce

1 1/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese

Cook penne pasta as directed on the package. While pasta is cooking, heat a large skillet over medium/high heat with drizzle of olive oil. Add bell peppers, onion, and cooked chicken breasts. (If using uncooked chicken, add it to the pan 5 minutes before the peppers, cooking thoroughly.)

Cook covered for about 7 minutes stirring occasionally under peppers are tender crisp. Mix in Tomato & Basil sauce and simmer for 5 minutes. Gently mix in strained penne pasta. ENJOY!

# Manager's Report by Rob Clarkson



If there is snow in the forecast, please refrain from parking on the roadways. Our Maintenance crew will be working to clear roads after a 2" accumulation and vehicles parked along roadway make this task more difficult to accomplish.

Dues and Assessments are due January  $1^{\text{st}}$ . We are continuing our collection efforts. Members who may have difficulty staying current with this requirement should contact the office and communicate with us any special needs. We face many challenges with respect to budget due to rising costs of all materials, labor, Ins etc.

2022 is almost behind us and we have made great strides as an association to curtail costs, repair our roads, and sustain the natural beauty of our community. We

resurfaced another 5 miles of our roadways, finished another section of drainage improvements, gave our tennis courts a face lift with the added pickle ball courts, and made our cable at the marina easier for our membership to keep locked. In addition, we added a Code Enforcement Officer who is responsible for keeping us all in check with our Covenants, By-Laws, and Rules. In 2023 we will continue these efforts and do all we can to make our community a safer place for all who live here.

Pay your Dues and Assessments by close of business Feb 14<sup>th</sup> in full and you will be entered in the drawing for this years assessments refund. One winner will receive \$660.00 assessment back to be drawn at Board of Directors meeting February 22nd, 2023.

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





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### **Holiday Shores Snow & Ice Removal**

Snow plowing and ice control begins when there is two inches of snow and more is expected or when ice begins to make the roads hazardous. Ice control material is applied to location an "as needed" basis. It takes 4-5 hours to plow the entire community with only two inches of snow. Please drive with caution anytime winter precipitation are on the roads.

DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE TO SEE IF THE SNOW PLOWS ARE OUT OR TO REPORT SNOW. PLEASE BE PATIENT.

Heavy traffic hills and main roads are plowed first.

### What caution should I be aware of?

Do not park on the road during the snow removal process. Do not push snow on to the roadway, this creates a very hazardous condition.

### What about driveways?

Maintenance personnel are not authorized to plow driveways & plows will not be lifted at the entrance to each individual driveway.

Clearance of driveway entrances is the responsibility of the resident.

Plows may make several passes in order to widen the roads.

### What about mailboxes?

The truck will get as close to the mailboxes as possible. It is the homeowner's responsibility to keep the area in front of the mailbox cleared. Keep mailboxes closed at all times.

### What about trashcans on pick up days?

Trashcans & recycle containers must be 4' off the road.

The snowplow drivers will not get out to move your containers and will not be responsible for damage.

### **USE CAUTION!!**

When maintenance is out on the roads, stay a safe distance behind the trucks. If you cannot see the mirrors on the trucks, they will not be able to see you.
